Focus Area 2: Enrollment




- Social and Behavioral Sciences will launch a new Social Justice ADT

- Communications and External Relations will develop marketing plans for CTE programs and the college








Focus Area 3: Instructional Quality



- English and math faculty will further implement AB 705 through curricular changes and support for students
- Faculty Learning Institute will structure Flex Day activities supporting the Chancellor's Office "Call to Action" and the board of trustees' resolution to address structural racism







Focus Area 4: Instructional Responsiveness



- Social and Behavioral Sciences faculty will develop curriculum addressing equity, race, and social justice
- CTCE will develop a new program entitled "Product Design and Development Technology"







Focus Area 5: Student Support



- Veterans Success Center will create a virtual tour of the Center
- Student support programs will promote their specialized services via Canvas
- CalWORKs will offer instructional videos to increase student comfort level with online learning







Focus Area 5: Student Support (continued)



- DSPS students will participate in the APIDC "Anxiety Resources for Campus Health (ARCH)" pilot program
- Financial Aid office will streamline the verification process through a financial mobile platform







Focus Area 6: Safe Environment



- Human Resources will provide training related to health requirements and protocols for a safe return to campus
- College spaces targeted for future instructional use will undergo rigid cleaning and sanitizing per COVID-19 guidelines







Focus Area 7: Sustainability



- Facilities will implement a sustainable schedule of operation of the Central Plant during the campus closure
- of the campus grounds and the college's sustainable landscapes







Focus Area 8: Technological Advancement



- TeCS will upgrade projector and sound system switching for greater reliability and lecture effectiveness
- TeCS will complete full migration of faculty and staff email to Office 365 improving the college's overall collaboration while reducing costs
- TeCS will implement Banner 9 Financial
 Aid Self-Service for students








Focus Area 9: Diversity and Equity

- Academic deans will encourage and support a broad revision of course curricula, adding topics related to diversity, equity, and inclusion








Focus Area 10: Image
