

College Readiness

- The director of continuing education to provide opportunities for noncredit students to experience introductory credit courses

- Admissions and Records to increase BCM notifications with key information targeting specific groups of students to deliver timesensitive alerts








Instructional Quality

- Administer the fall 2021 Student Experience Survey
- Academic deans and faculty to develop new certificates of achievement in Accounting and Kinesiology
- Academic deans and faculty (math Community of Practice groups) to engage in activities to promote student-centered, culturally relevant teaching practices





Instructional Responsiveness

Citrus College will respond to regional economic and workforce demands.

- Academic deans and CTE faculty to identify new certificate of achievement programs and enhance existing Business and Accounting skill awards
- The director of continuing education to develop new noncredit programs related to short-term vocational workforce development
- Academic deans and faculty to pursue the development of internship opportunities for all CAPs and CTE programs





Student Support

Citrus College will provide effective and comprehensive student support services that contribute to a successful collegiate experience.

- Student Health Center to facilitate a "What You Need to Know About the COVID-19 Vaccine" informative workshop for students
- DSPS to streamline operations by implementing new case management software
- Veteran Success Center to develop an instructional video series and pilot a peer mentor program
- Student Services programs to generate BCM alerts informing students about career services and financial aid benefits





Safe Environment

Citrus College will promote a safe and secure educational and workplace environment.

- Campus Safety to introduce new digital radios for quicker, more secure emergency response communications
- Campus Safety to host a college-wide forum and produce short videos to promote a welcoming environment
- Campus Safety to conduct a cost-and-benefit analysis of an updated campus parking system which will streamline processes and add convenience





Sustainability

Citrus College will promote the economic and social benefits of environmental sustainability and will implement sustainable practices.

- Ancillary equipment and goods to be repurposed or recycled during the ED building modernization
- The Sustainability Committee and facilities to educate and engage constituent groups in sustainable design standards
- The Sustainability Committee to engage constituent groups through the implementation of the Measure Y bond program





Technological Advancement

Citrus College will anticipate and address technological needs that foster an efficient and effective educational and administrative environment.

- The TeCS team to assist the Guided Pathways workgroup in launching a student-friendly webpage featuring the seven CAPs
- The TeCS team, together with Student Services, to develop a student-centered action item checklist unique to each student
- TeCS to assist Fiscal Services in the development of electronic processes utilizing the new Business Enhancement System Transformation (BEST) Advantage System

Citrus College will proactively assess and address the needs of the diverse college community to continually foster a culture of equity,

- CalWORKs to create a new counseling course designed for student-parents
- School Relations and Outreach to pilot an expansion of the Promise program

- Counseling and Advisement to offer a new course geared toward teaching cultural literacy and awareness
- Counseling and Advisement to implement a Black Scholars program
