Public works employees have one of the most important jobs in today's society: developing and maintaining a safe and healthy infrastructure. Education and training are essential.

Public Works includes construction, alteration, repair or improvement on public land that is executed at the cost of the state or any other local public agency.

The Maintenance Superintendents Association (MSA) endorses the Citrus College Public Works Certificate of Achievement. Students who complete the Citrus College program can also transfer to the University of La Verne Bachelor of Science in Public Administration program. Three of the Public Works Certificate of Achievement courses are available online through Distance Education, and courses are also offered at employers' sites off-campus.

The Public Works program is designed to prepare students who wish to seek entry level employment in the Public Works industry or qualify for a more responsible position within the field. The Citrus College Public Works program offers two 18-unit Certificates of Achievement.
