COLLEGE GOALS
2004-2005 SCHOOL YEAR**

1. Increase the success rates of Citrus College students in the areas of transfer, basic skills, and vocational education.
2. Begin strengthening the instructional program by encouraging the development of student learning outcomes for all curriculum.
3. Increase student access to Citrus College by continuing to lobby for the extension of the Gold Line into the San Gabriel and Inland Valleys with a station serving Citrus College and Azusa Pacific University.
4. Increase opportunities for students to continue their education by partnering with four-year colleges and universities such as Azusa Pacific University, the University of La Verne, Cal Poly Pomona, and others to offer advanced degrees in subjects such as teacher education, physical education, music, business, and nursing.
5. Explore the possibility of establishing a University Center for advanced degrees as a component of the Center for Innovation and in close proximity to the proposed Gold Line College Station.
6. Continue to promote the retention of local control.
7. Increase communication in all areas of campus and community life.
8. Promote and increase diversity in faculty and staff.
9. Strengthen our ability to influence state and federal legislation by holding meetings with federal and state legislators to discuss items of importance to Citrus College and the students and communities we serve.
10. Increase the visibility and influence of Citrus College within the communities that comprise the Citrus Community College District through a variety of means including meeting with K-12 school board members, city officials, business representatives, and other influential groups.
11. Explore the creation of events that will promote Citrus College programming, such as a jazz festival and a decathlon, each featuring top rate musicians and athletes.
12. Explore the possibility of restoring Hayden Hall into an upscale conference center that includes exhibits featuring the history of Citrus College.
