### **Our Mission**

The Office of Institutional Research, Planning and Effectiveness (IRPE) supports the college's mission by supplying institutional and external data to the college's major planning efforts such as the EFMP; providing data and analysis needed for all areas' program review; monitoring progress toward institutional priorities and commitments on the collegewide measurable objectives; conducting research for major college activities and initiatives such as Guided Pathways, Student Equity and Achievement Program, and the implementation of AB 705; and coordinating annual planning efforts under the Strategic Plan.

In essence, IRPE supports the college and all programs through research, data analysis, program evaluation, and planning. Routine research projects include instructional program review data packets, survey design and implementation, and evaluation reports. Major planning responsibilities include overseeing the creation of the five-year Strategic Plan and the annual review and update of the Integrated Planning Manual.






Figure 3: Students by Ethnicity
