HIST 107H Political and Social History of the United States 3 Units

Meet Honors Program entrance requirements that include eligibility for ENG 101 or completion of equivalent.

The course is a survey of the political, economic and social development of North American and the United States to 1876. Students will evaluate the forces that work to create political, economic, diplomatic, and social change in colonial and early US history, along with how individuals, society and government respond to change. Students will also study the historiography of early American history by evaluating how historical interpretation has changed over the years. Students will also engage in their own historiography by creating an original research paper focused on early U. S. history. The course is designed to create a stronger comprehension of early US history and strengthen analytical, critical thinking, community/global consciousness and communication skills. 54 lecture hours. HIST 155 History of the Vietnam War 3 Units

Strongly recommended: ENGL 100. Also, READ 099 if required by reading placement exam or if required by reading level.

An examination of the background and involvement of America in the Vietnam War. The course will primarily focus on the American involvement in Southeast Asia, but will also examine the origins of Vietnamese nationalism and the struggle for independence in Vietnam and its global implications and manifestations. A Cold War framework developed early in the course will be utilized to understand U.S. involvement in the Vietnam War. The course will conclude with an assessment of the long term effects of the Vietnam War on American society and the rest of the world. 54 lecture hours. CSU UC
