The emphasis is upon the analysis of issues, problems, and situations represented in fiction, drama and poetry, and on the development of effective written arguments in support of the analysis. Meets the IGETC critical thinking requirement. 54 lecture hours. CSU UC						ENGL 261 Introduction to U.S. American Literature I 3 Units Strongly recommended: ENGL 099 or READ 099 if required by English placement or if required by English level. Students will explore the context and influence of American literature from the Colonial period to the Civil War.
