A course in elementary Spanish grammar, vocabulary, and pronunciation which focuses on understanding, speaking, reading, and writing (including spelling) simple Spanish and serves as an introduction to the geography, history, and culture of the Spanish-speaking world. 90 lecture hours. CSU UC

### SPAN 201 Spanish III

**5 Units**

Strongly recommended: Fluent in Spanish or completion of SPAN 102. Also, ENGL 099 or READ 099 if required by English placement or if required by English level.

This intermediate level course was created with both native Spanish speakers and students studying Spanish as a second language in mind. Current social themes and vocabulary support a comprehensive review of Spanish grammar.

The discussion of contemporary cultural topics, the reading of authentic texts, and the development of writing skills are all features of this class that help all intermediate Spanish students to refine and enjoy using their language skills.

Class is conducted primarily in Spanish. Note that Spanish 3 and 4 do not need to be taken in order. 90 lecture hours. CSU UC
