Citrus Board of Trustees Host K-12 Mixer

Citrus College was host to a reception for area K-12 superintendents and board members on Wednesday, October 11. Invitees included trustees and superintendents from Azusa USD, Claremont USD, Duarte USD, Glendora USD and Monrovia USD. The meeting was well attended, with representatives from all five local school districts, as well as Citrus College board members, Mrs. Joanne Montgomery, board vice president, Dr. Edward C. Ortell, board clerk/secretary, Ms. Susan M. Keith, board member, and Dr. Gary L. Woods, board member.



The purpose of the mixer was to inform K-12 superintendents and board members about Citrus College outreach efforts and programs designed to help students succeed in their college experience. Ms. Irene Malmgren, vice president of instruction, presented information on instructional programs, Dr. Jeanne Hamilton discussed new and ongoing outreach efforts and Dr. Michael Viera, president/superintendent, provided an update on facilities master planning. A question and answer period followed the presentations.

The outcome of the meeting was positive, with participants expressing appreciation for the opportunity to learn more about how our programs are helping their students. The meeting also provided a forum to explore possibilities for future collaboration and an opportunity to further strengthen relationships between Citrus College and area high schools.

College Heads Up Public Works Certificate

Maintaining the public infrastructure is a constant, ongoing process. Because of this, the need for education in the area of Public Works is extremely high. In response to this increasing demand, Citrus College has entered into a collaborative relationship with Palomar College, Santiago Canyon College, the Maintenance Superintendents Association (MSA) and the American Public Works Association (APWA) in an effort to better serve the students, employees and employers in the Public Works industry. "Citrus College has taken the lead in working with colleges and industry leaders both throughout the state and beyond state lines to provide a much needed service," said Dr. Kim Holland, director of vocational education at Citrus College. "Together we have created a standardized Public Works Certificate that will help students enter the field or be eligible for promotion."

According to Holland, only five community colleges in the state of California offer a program in Public Works. Of these five, only three are active. The Public Works Certificate will provide students with curriculum coordination and the flexibility provided by attending three different colleges.
