

Campus Construction Update

Effective Tuesday, October 24, the construction area north of the LB Building will expand. As previously mentioned, a section of the north/south walkway between the Administration and LB Buildings will be fenced off, becoming part of the construction area.

Additionally, the construction area will expand to the east, temporarily blocking the east/west walkway just south of the flag poles in the quad. The image above shows the construction area fencing in green and recommended paths of travel in blue.

Please note that there is no handicapped access to anywhere from the easternmost portion off the blocked-off ramp/walkway just south of the flag poles. Facilities will post signs to detour students as much as possible. They ask that the campus community excuse their mess. Thank you for your patience.



Introducing Technology And Computer Services

On October 3, the Board of Trustees approved the reorganization of the old MIS department. In light of this reorganization, the department name has been officially changed to Technology and Computer Services (TeCS).



The new name was proposed and chosen by the departments for several reasons. First, it includes the word "service" to emphasize the fact that the department is a support organization to all other departments and divisions of the college. The terms "technology" and "computer" indicate that support will be provided for all areas of information technology.

The TeCS Department is organized around four functional areas: Network, Central Computing and Telecommunications; Technology Operations and Support Services; Instructional and Administrative Systems Development; and Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) Project.
