## Owl Athletes Soar During Fall '06 Season



It's been a banner season for the Citrus College Fighting Owls, as this year's fall sports have been headlined by some teams competing for championships and some teams climbing up the ladder of athletic success.



The Citrus College Football team is flying high after defeating the previously undefeated Glendale two weeks ago. The win put a stranglehold on the WSC South and put the Fighting Owls in line for a fourth straight WSC South championship. If the Fighting Owls can defeat their next two opponents Citrus College will grab an automatic berth into the SoCal football playoffs.

The Lady Owls volleyball squad is flying similarly high, as they continue their march through their WSC competition. Until last week the Lady Owls were cruising through WSC play, but ran into a wall losing back to back games to Canyons and LA Pierce. Both those matches were thrillers as the Lady Owls barely lost; losing both matches in 5 games. The Lady Owls still have a shot at the WSC title with re-matches against both squads in the coming week that promise to be the matches of the year.



The Lady Owls soccer team has pulled themselves out of the doldrums of the WSC by posting their best season in over a decade. After spending the last three years, with only 1 total win in that time frame, the Lady Owls have soared to a 7-6-5 record, and 3rd place in the WSC South.

With most of the early sports winding down, basketball is getting ready to begin as the men host two home contests this week. Head coach Rick Croy has garnered a lot of attention for his squad as they look to continue to climb up the WSC ladder. Last year's squad finished 3rd in the WSC, but looks to vastly improve upon that, by returning some seasoned veterans and adding some much needed the depth. There is no doubt that they will be a force to be reckoned with in SoCal Community College Basketball.
