

Building HVAC Replacement Information

This year, the Facilities department is again planning on replacing large, aging Heating, Ventilating, and Air Conditioning (HVAC) systems in several of our buildings. This work is scheduled to be done from March 9 through May 1. The buildings that will be affected this year are as follows: Educational Development Center, Infant Center, Lecture Halls, and Hayden Hall. Facilities will keep the appropriate deans and department heads apprised as scheduling solidifies. "While the prospect of being without HVAC in your building is not a pleasant one, I believe we are all better off with planned outages as opposed to surprise breakdowns - which become increasingly likely with aging equipment," said Mike Harrington, director of facilities and construction.



Empty Bowls Soup Supper Event Planned




