Citrus College Receives Tech Prep Grant



Citrus College will be awarded \$461,000 by the California Department of Education to serve as the lead partner of the Tech Prep Regional Coordination Project for LA County.

Eleven of eighteen LA County community colleges are partners in the project that will build resource and referral networks connecting all the local Tech Prep consortium members and support career technical education initiatives that serve the county. Over the next thirteen months the Steering Committee, comprised of leaders from the secondary, postsecondary, business/industry, WIB, and economic development sectors, will oversee development of a centralized information network, guidelines for articulation and work-based learning, delivery of professional development, and implementation of six career pathway mini-projects. Dr. Lyla Eddington, Executive Director of the Los Angeles & Orange County Regional Consortium will serve as Project Director.

"This is a tremendous opportunity for Citrus College and our Tech Prep Consortium members that represent area high schools and ROPs. The LA college partners asked us to serve as the lead and fiscal agent," Marti DeYoung said. "We are prepared to share our successes and learn from the best practices of others. The information and resources will support the collective goal to increase the relevance between lifelong learning and improved career outcomes." The LA County project begins June 1, 2007.

Beginning July 1, the traditional Tech Prep grant at Citrus College is funded through the Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education Act of 2006. Tech Prep initiatives connect instructional programs between the secondary and postsecondary education systems. Marti DeYoung's role is to serve faculty and support curriculum development including course-to course alignment with our high school and regional occupational program partners.
