The Flex Committee has been busy preparing special Flex Day activities for faculty and staff before the start of the spring 2008 semester. The theme for the event, which will be held on February 19, is student engagement. There will also be a variety of workshops throughout the morning and afternoon dealing with student issues, student learning outcome assessment, and Office 2007 technology. Construction Continues Across Campus

A variety of construction projects will be occurring during the upcoming months. As a result, several changes will be taking place on campus:

- *The demolition and construction of the new Vocational Technology Building will commence immediately after the start of winter break, at which time the construction fencing will be installed.*
- *After winter break, staff parking will be available along the east side of the Gym and the new staff parking at the lower section of the east parking lot. Student lot S8 will remain open except for a few parking spaces at the north end.*
- *Pedestrian access to Tech C will be from the north or west, immediately south of P1. Access to Hayden Hall will be from the north. Access to Tech E will be through Tech A and access to Tech A will be from the west or east entrances. Access to Tech G will be from the south and Tech F from either G or Barranca.*

Revised maps will be available after Winter Break.


