## Owls Hit Stockton for State Championships



With Saturday's win against L.A. City College, the number-one seeded Owls basketball team's record moves to 32 and 1 overall. The final score in the nailbiter was 99-95 in overtime. They will now advance to the state championships held this weekend in Stockton, California; they will play in the state quarter-finals on Friday. The only other time a Citrus team has reached this level was in 1999 and 2000, when the men's water polo teams became state runners-up and champions, respectively. "This has been a historic team," said Andrew Wheeler, sports information coordinator. "No other Citrus men's basketball team has gone this far or done this well."


