Citrus Delegation Will Attend MTA Meeting

ASCC is continuing its support of the "I Will Ride" campaign, encouraging the Metro Transit Board to bring the Gold Line east to Montclair. The eastward expansion, which has been stalled, would include a stop next to Citrus. ASCC hopes to pack the MTA meeting on Thursday, April 24 with members of the Citrus community, particularly students. A private donor has secured bus transportation from Citrus to the Sierra Madre Villa station of the Gold Line, which delegates will ride to Union Station. Buses will then take participants to the MTA building for a press conference of students and then onto the MTA Board Meeting. Red "I Will Ride" T-shirts and lunch will be provided. Training Offered in CCC Confer Technology

Faculty and staff can be trained in CCC Confer on Friday, May 16 from 11 a.m. to noon. Funded through the Chancellor's Office, CCC Confer allows conferencing and communications using the latest web-based technology. You can hold meetings, conferences and office hours through this technology without special equipment. You can do the training anywhere, as long as you have a computer with Internet access and a telephone. To log in for training: 1) Connect to the toll-free conference line by dialing 1-888-886-3951 and entering the pass code 185182; 2) Connect to the training room by logging onto www.cccconfer.org, clicking on the TRAINING CENTER tab on the menu bar, and selecting "Log in Here" on the ONLINE TRAINING tab. From there, you will be directed as to how to log in.

Study Abroad Opportunities

The Study Abroad program will hit Austria and Italy from July 3 through 22.

Participants will visit destinations like Salzburg, Vienna, Venice and Rome. An art history and appreciation class taught by instructor Sandra Johnson and a music appreciation class taught by instructor Gunnar Eisel will allow students to earn transferable units. A cost of \$4,495 includes round-trip airfare; 18 nights in hotels; 31 meals; transportation in a motor coach; and admission fees for museums, tours and excursions.



The Study Abroad Program will again offer the opportunity for students to immerse themselves in European culture during the Fall 2008 semester. A Citrus delegation will travel to London from Sept. 10 through Nov. 22, earning CSU/UC transferrable units and taking in British life and culture. Lorna Luft will bring the songs of her mother, legendary songstress Judy Garland, to the Haugh on Sunday, April 27 at 2 p.m. The critically acclaimed musical tribute "Songs My Mother Taught Me" will combine Garland's beloved songbook with multimedia segments and intensely personal and often hilarious memories of the woman who took the world over the rainbow. Luft, who has been called "an incandescent revelation" by the Los Angeles Times, will be joined by Citrus' Blue Note Swing Orchestra as she presents standards like "Come Rain or Come Shine," "The Man That Got Away," and "Rock-A-Bye Your Baby with a Dixie Melody." Admission is \$28, \$26 for students/seniors.
