

The Child Development Center's Foster Care Programs would like you to know that The Foundation for California Community Colleges (FCCC) is currently hiring mentors/tutors for the Youth Empowerment Strategies for Success - Los Angeles County (YESS-LA). These positions pay anywhere from \$11 to \$13 per hour. As mentors/tutors, successful applicants will be aiding foster youth ages 14- and 15-years-old who have low academic scores.

Citrus College has been providing life skill classes to 16- through 21-year-olds on campus and in the community for nearly 19 years. Additionally, Citrus College has provided educational guidance to 14 and 15-year-olds in out-of-home care. However, this is the second year that Citrus College will be part of the revised YESS-LA program.
