Citrus will commemorate Black History Month Thursday, February 28 with "Portraits of Courage: African-Americans You Should Have Known." Walker, the first woman millionaire of any race; Colonel Charles Young, the third African-American graduate of West Point, who went on to become the highest ranking black officer in the U.S. Army; and Ida B. Wells-Barnett, anti-lynching crusader, suffragist, journalist, and speaker. Starring Will Owens and Christy Joy Wilson, the 65-minute production will be held in the Haugh. Irish Rovers at the Haugh


