Chancellor Comments on Budget Proposal

Last week, Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger released his proposed state budget for 2008-2009. This budget included dramatic cuts to education. California Community College Chancellor Diane Woodruff issued the following statement in response:

"The California Community Colleges received a reduction of \$525 million that includes a two-thirds reduction in growth funds. Due to this reduction, we estimate that we will not be able to serve 52,000 new students next year. As the state's largest provider of workforce training, the community colleges are critical to maintaining a healthy, growing economy. We recognize the fiscal dilemma that our Governor is forced to deal with, but we hope that we can continue to work closely with him to minimize the negative impact to our community colleges."
