
Citrus College Chosen to Receive Grant

Citrus College was one of 10 higher education institutions chosen to receive a \$100,000 grant from the Wal-Mart Foundation. The donation, which is Wal-Mart's way of celebrating Veteran's Day, were given to higher education institutions that currently have successful veteran educational assistance programs.

The purpose of the grant is to support the development of new and existing programs and provide resources to assist veterans with access to education, adjustment to civilian life and success in completing their degrees.

The Clarion Online, the Clarion newspaper website (www.theclariononline.com) has made student media history. Three student Clarion editors and their adviser Meg O'Neil recently attended the national student media convention in Kansas, Missouri. More than 2,000 students and faculty advisers from two-year and four-year colleges and universities, both public and private, were in attendance at the four-day event. At the awards ceremony,

officials representing the Associated Collegiate Press announced that the Citrus College Clarion website has won the highest award in the country: the "Pacemaker." This award honors programs which "set the pace" for student media. Citrus College is one of only two community colleges in the nation to receive this top award.
