Salwak's New Book Shares Experiences

On April 1, 2008, language arts instructor Dale Salwak will celebrate the release of his 24th book. Published by the University of Iowa Press, "Teaching Life: Letters from a Life in Literature" reflects on the author's 30-year career of teaching literature. Salwak conceived of the idea for the book—part epistolary memoir and part handbook—30 years ago when a promising student died in a car accident while on her way to Salwak's office to discuss career plans. "I found myself wondering if anything I had said in class had made a difference in her too-short life or, for that matter, in the lives of any of my students," he explains.



Though the book is intended to be enjoyed by everybody, Salwak hopes the book will provide perspective to new and aspiring educators: "It is both a reflection on a life in literature and a primer on teaching as a vocation. . . The book captures the enlightenment and sheer joy that literary studies can offer professors and students." Salwak's book, available in bookstores at the start of April, can be pre-ordered through a variety of online book distributors.

Flex Day Activities Rapidly Approaching

The theme for the event, which will be held on February 19, is student engagement.
