

Scholarship Deadline Approaching


Please inform your students that applications for Fall 2008 scholarships from the Citrus College Foundation are available in the Admissions and Records Office. Sixteen scholarships, ranging from \$300 to \$5,000, are available for students transferring to a four-year school in summer or fall of 2008. Over 100 scholarships, from \$100-\$1,000, are available for new and continuing Citrus students.



Scholarships requiring department recommendations are also available. These include funds for students involved in Alpha Gamma Sigma, Biological Sciences, Health Occupations, Journalism, Vocal or Instrumental Music, Entertainment Technology, Physical Education, Social Sciences and Water Technology. 
Duke's Orchestra Brings Jazz Favorites to Haugh
