During the meeting, MTA Board President Pat O'Connor said, "I'd like to ask staff for a report on the Gold Line, its status and readiness, because of the support shown today."

## New Center for Innovation to be Dedicated

The Louis E. Zellers Center for Innovation will be dedicated Tuesday, May 6 at 3 p.m. The three-story building features more than 87 offices for faculty and deans and houses the Citrus College Foundation, External Relations, Study Abroad and Distance Education. It is the first campus building fully funded by Measure G, a \$121 million bond measure passed by district voters in 2004. Staff will be granted release time to attend the dedication. Tours will be offered afterwards between 4:15 to 5:15 p.m.


## Theme Park Tickets Available
