

## Earth Day Keynote Speaker

Award-winning conservationist Dr. Biruté M.F. Galdikas will be the keynote speaker at the inaugural Citrus College Earth Day Celebration on Friday, April 24, 2009.

Galdikas will speak on the topic "Going Green by Saving Orangutans and the Tropical Forest" at noon in the campus center. Most well-known for her association with the legendary anthropologist Dr. Louis Leakey, Galdikas began studying orangutans in Indonesia Borneo in 1971. Leakey's support earned her a spot as the third member of "Leakey's Angels," a trio of women handpicked to study great apes in their natural habitat. She joined Jane Goodall who was studying chimpanzees in Tanzania and Diane Fossey who became a martyr in her quest to protect mountain gorillas in Rwanda.
