

# CENTER FOR TEACHER EXCELLENCE NON-INSTRUCTIONAL ANNUAL PROGRAM REVIEW and PLAN 2012

#### 1. Program Description/Mission:

The Center for Teacher Excellence is a HSI Title V Cooperative grant funded program designed to prepare tomorrow's teachers today through technology.

#### 2. Key functions/goals of this Department/Program:

The program has three key important functions and five activity objectives.

- I. Improving the Education Career Pathway for Students To improve the education career pathway for students, Citrus College and our grant partner, the University of La Verne will:
  - CC/ULV will establish additional articulation agreements/MOUs for majors with California State Universities, University of California campuses, and private institutions to give students more transfer options.
  - Expand preparation workshops and activities for students to successfully pass the California Basic Education Skills Test (CBEST) and the required California Subject Examination for Teachers (CSET). Failure to pass CBEST will disqualify teacher education students from being accepted into any university teacher preparation program. Failure to pass CSET can prevent liberal studies majors from receiving a bachelor's degree if they are enrolled in a blended program. CC and ULV will implement an aggressive campaign to inform and alert students about these requirements and promote preparation courses/workshops and early testing.
  - Track students who transfer, where, and if/when they complete their bachelor's degree. Both institutions will contract with National Student Clearinghouse annually to access this data.
  - Introduce e-portfolios. CC teacher education students will begin to create their teacher portfolios electronically using the same platform as ULV. When CC students transfer to the ULV teacher education program, they will carry with them their electronic portfolios.
- II. Establishing a Scholastic Technology Literacy Summer Camp for Students
  To improve the Education Pathway for Students, Citrus College and the University of La Verne
  will establish a Scholastic Technology Literacy summer camp focused on technology integration for
  Teacher Education Program (TEP) students at CC and ULV. The summer technology camps will
  include:
  - Awareness of the Consequences of a Digital Footprint
  - Tips and Tricks of Article Searching
  - Skype! Take, Video and Share files for free
  - Everybody's Doing it: eBooks

- Copyright Literature, Accessible Images and Music
- Word: Using Citations for MLA/APA
- RefWorks: Making Bibliographies in a Snap
- My EbscoHost: A Whole New Way of Searching
- E-portfolios: Learning the platform and uploading work history content
- III. Creating an Academy for Faculty Instructional Technology in Course Cohorts
  This key function will improve on technology pedagogy for instructional faculty by,
  - Create the Academy for Faculty Instructional Technology Training: In partnership with ULV, CC will establish a hub for training in the latest technology, make strategic technology purchases per the grant budget, and provide on-going training, support, and guidance for the faculty cohorts.
  - Develop and offer an instructional technology certificate for faculty members. Modeled after ULV, CC faculty will be certified in course management systems, technology integration, and pedagogical approaches with technology.
  - Create a ULV Technology Content Development Department (TCDD) as part of the Center for Teaching & Learning (CTL). The TCDD will focus its attention on providing media-rich content for teacher education-related courses. The products will be shared with CC faculty cohort learning teams.

#### The five objectives are:

- By September 30, 2016, increase by 60% the number of students in Teacher Education Programs (TEP) over the zero percent 2008 baseline that will overcome technology literacy and integration deficiencies as measured by completion of summer bridge programs.
- II. By September 30, 2016, increase to 30% the number of teacher prep Citrus College Students will complete the Teacher Education Program (TEP) over the 14% 2009-2010 Baseline.
- III. By September 30, 2016, a minimum of 30 faculty members at Citrus College will have completed technology training based on the University of La Verne model that leads to significant course enhancements in technology compared to baseline of zero.
- IV. By September 30, 2016, increase by 10 additional teacher education-related major articulation agreements/MOUs from baseline of 6.
- V. By September 30, 2016, the University of La Verne will improve and enhance instructional technology resources on campus by redesigning courses to include technology rich course content to model best teaching practices in both on ground and hybrid delivery, focusing on transforming 100% of the Liberal Studies Program courses by 2016.
