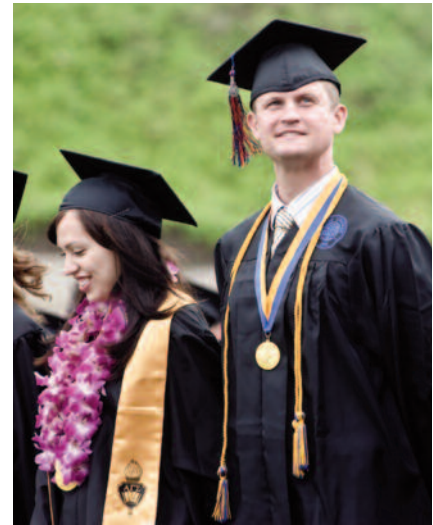

### Graduating with Honors

Citrus College students who have completed the Honors Program and students who earn grade point averages of 3.3 or more, often graduate from the college with an Honors designation.

Of the 1,246 members of the Class of 2011, 249—or 20%—graduated with honors. Many of these students transferred to prestigious colleges and universities such as UCLA, UC Berkeley and Columbia University, and some entered the workforce to pursue their chosen careers.

Thirty-two graduates completed the Citrus College Honors Program and nearly 50 students graduated as members of the Alpha Gamma Sigma, Phi Theta Kappa and Psi Beta honor societies.
