UNDOCUMENTED STUDENT GUIDE

The Citrus College Career/Transfer Center (CTC) assists undocumented students in their career exploration process. You and a career counselor may explore personality, interests, values, and skills and how they can be applied to a career of your interest. You may learn and discuss education, professional licenses, accreditations, and certifications needed for careers of interest. In addition, you may also learn at what point immigration status may become a barrier along your career path and develop a career education plan.

To explore and learn more about oneself, the CTC offers career assessments for students. Assessments are used when working with students, regardless of immigration status, to help them examine their personal experiences and identify their personal assets.



NON-TRADITIONAL STUDENT CAREER PLANNING MODEL



The **traditional student career planning model** assumes that all individuals possess legal citizenship and have opportunities for employment. Operating from a traditional career development framework may not fully capture the career development process of undocumented students because of legal systemic barriers. Undocumented students may not have the opportunity to select a job that coincides with their self-concept or is based on their interests and goals (Ortiz & Hinojosa, 2010).

The **non-traditional student career planning model** is recommended when working with undocumented/DACAmented students. The model captures students' experiences as individuals while supporting and validating their career development process.



EXPLORING CAREERS & MAJORS AS AN UNDOCUMENTED STUDENT

Many students have difficulty choosing a major or career. Undocumented students experience additional challenges on what majors or careers they can pursue. The CTC is committed to helping undocumented students make wise career choices and does not discourage students from pursuing their dream career because of their undocumented status.

It is important for students to understand that policies may change and can impact their undocumented status. The CTC works with students to think outside the box to develop the skills needed for their career of choice and non-employment opportunities.

PROFESSIONAL LICENSES REGARDLESS OF IMMIGRATION STATUS

The state of California has laws allowing individuals regardless of immigration status to obtain professional and occupational licensure, given that they meet all other requirements set forth by licensing boards. These laws assist students with navigating their career trajectory.

An important consideration: A licensed undocumented professional <u>without</u> work authorization may earn money as either an independent contractor or business owner as they cannot be hired legally as employees.

Senate Bill (SB) 1159

<u>SB 1159</u> is a California state law enacted in September 2014 that requires Department of Consumers Affairs (DCA) licensing boards to accept an Individual Taxpayer Identification Number (ITIN) in the place of a Social Security Number (SSN) for professional licenses. SB 1159 also prohibits any entity within the DCA from denying an applicant seeking a professional license based on immigration status. Review the <u>comprehensive list</u> of DCA licensing boards.

OTHER ASSEMBLY AND SENATE BILLS

Assembly Bill (AB) 2184

<u>AB 2184</u> is a California state law enacted in September 2018 that requires local governments (cities/counties) to accept a California ID/driver's license or ITIN in the place of a SSN in issuing business licenses.

Senate Bill (SB) 695

<u>SB 695</u> is a California state law enacted in September 2018 that prohibit licensing boards from requiring an individual to disclose either citizenship status or immigration status for purposes of licensure, or from denying licensure to an otherwise qualified and eligible individual based solely on his or her citizenship status or immigration.

Assembly Bill (AB) 1024

<u>AB 1024</u> is an assembly bill enacted in October 2013 that authorizes the Supreme Court to admit an applicant as an attorney at law in all the courts of the state, upon certification of the State Bar of California.

Senate Bill (SB) 788

<u>SB 788</u> is a senate bill enacted in February 2021 that prohibits consideration of race, religious creed, color, national origin, gender, marital status, sex, sexual identity, or sexual orientation to determine the approximate percentage of the permanent disability caused by other factors. The bill aims to eliminate bias and discrimination in the workers compensations system.

Senate Bill (SB) 1139:

<u>SB 1139</u> is a senate bill enacted in September 2016 that prohibits specified programs administered by any public or private postsecondary educational institution that offers such a program from denying admissions based on the citizenship status or immigration status of the applicant.

Q & A FOR PROFESSIONAL EDUCATION

REGISTERED NURSING

Can students in California apply to nursing program(s) without a Social Security Number (SSN)?

Yes, California Medical DREAMER opportunity Act Senate Bill (SB 1139) prohibits medical degree programs from denying admission to students based on their citizenship or immigration status.

Can students get a background check without SSN or Employment Authorization Document (EAD)?

Yes, students do not need a SSN or EAD to get a background check. It is recommended to speak with the nursing program, clinical site and company running the background check for further instructions on how to proceed.

Can students take the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX) with an ITIN and apply for their professional license in California?

Yes, California Board of Registered Nursing (BRN) will accept an ITIN to apply for the NCLEX.


LAW SCHOOL

Can students apply and practice law without SSN?

Yes, Assembly Bill 1024 authorizes the Supreme Court to allow applicants who are not lawfully present in the United States to practice law.

Can students take the State Bar of California and apply for their processional license in California?

Yes, applicants who do not have a SSN are required to submit a request for an exemption during the online registration process. Applicants are not required to have a SSN to be admitted to practice law in California.



JOB SEARCH STRATEGIES FOR PAID AND UNPAID OPPORTUNITIES

The secret to volunteer, internship, and employment opportunities for undocumented students is to find experiences that will allow you to develop diverse **transferable skills**. The job/internship search process is a **job in itself**. When searching for opportunities, consider the following:

- 1. Type of position, type of institution/employer, geographic preference o Is it a DREAMer friendly company?
 - o Is it geographically undocumented friendly?
- 2. Skills you wish to develop/strengthen to attain career goals o What skills have you acquired from classes or non-paid opportunities?
- 3. Short/long term goals for achieving career goals o Make an action plan of your short-term and long-term goals

STRATEGY 2: IDENTIFY TRANSFRABLE SKILLS

Transferable Skills are a core set of skills and abilities that can be applied to a wide range of industries. Undocumented students should identify general and technology skills they hold along with the abilities recommended for their career of interest. Identifying these skills and abilities can assist you with developing into the desired employee.

As a student, you have an assorted number of transferable skills. It is important to profit from the skills you have gained and apply them to your everyday living to strengthen and market yourself in your career pathway.

Here are a few common transferable skills that can be transferred across industries.

	Example
Communication	Writing, speaking, listening
Critical Thinking	Analysis, problem-solving, strategic planning, decision making
Self-Management	Good time management, organized, motivated, responsible
Interpersonal	Understanding, diplomatic, discreet, supportive, assertive
Team Work	Work effectively in group, ability to work with others
Leadership	Initiative, take responsibility, build rapport with others, charismatic
Creativity	Develop, appreciate, nonconforming, adapt to change, problem solver
Interpersonal Skills	Advise clients, develop relationships, mediate problems, negotiate
Organizing Skills	Coordinate projects/events, meet deadlines
Research and Analytical Skills	Gather, interpret and analyses information, critical, evaluate information
Personal Development	Know yourself and find ways to develop, evaluate own performance
Information Technology	Effective use of computer and technology, IT skills, word processing, spreadsheets

ENTREPRENURESHIP & FREELANCING

Entrepreneurship, freelancing, setting up your Limited Liability Company (LLC) and working as a consultant are viable ways to pursue a career and generate income for undocumented individuals with or without work authorization. Whether by independent contracting or starting a business, various career opportunities exist through this avenue, ranging from photography and graphic design to legal services and tax preparation services. When researching a career of interest, the list below can offer undocumented students a sense of what opportunities exist and how earning a living would look through entrepreneurship or freelancing.

Note: If you are not eligible for a Social Security Number, it may be due to your immigration status. It is recommended to request an Individual Tax Identification Number (ITIN) to pay federally required taxes on your earned income. In many cases, ITINs can also be used to open up bank accounts or taking out loans.

CALIFORNIA DREAM ACT SERVICE INCENTIVE GRANT PROGRAM (DSIG)

The <u>California Dream Act Service Incentive Grant Program</u> encourages California Dream Act Application students with a Cal Grant B award to perform community or volunteer service. The California Student Aid Commission will award up to \$3,000 per academic year (up to \$1,500 per semester or \$1,000 per quarter) to 2,500 eligible students. The grant will be available to the student for up to 8 semesters or 12 quarters while they have a Cal Grant B award.

GLOSSARY OF TERMS

Career: The pursuit of a lifelong occupation with opportunities for advancement. Can require a degree or completed studies at a university or institution of higher education. It can involve special training and extensive knowledge in a particular field.

Career Development: The continuous process of managing one's life, learning and working in order to advance forward.

Career Planning: The process of choosing a career by engaging in self-knowledge, self-exploration and decision-making.

Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA): A policy that protects 8,000,000 people who entered the United States unlawfully as children. The policy allows individuals to receive a renewable two-year period of deferred action from deportation and become eligible for a work permit in the United States.

DREAMer: Young undocumented immigrants who were brought to the United States as children, who have lived and gone to school in the United States and often identify as American.

Entrepreneur: An individual who starts their own business.

Independent Contractor: A self-employed individual that provides a professional service or product for which they are specifically contracted and have complete control over the work (what will be done and how it will be done).

Individual Taxpayer Identification Number (ITIN): A tax processing number issued by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS). The IRS gives ITINs to individuals required to have a United States taxpayer identification number but do not have and are not eligible to obtain a Social Security Number from the Social Security Administration.

Industry: A group of establishments that provide similar services.

Major: A group of core classes required by a college in order to receive a degree in an area you specialize in.

Professional License: A state's grant of legal authority to practice a profession within a designated scope of practice.

Undocumented Student: A foreign national who: (1) entered the United States without inspection or with fraudulent documents or (2) entered legally as a nonimmigrant but then violated the terms of his or her stay and remained in the United States without authorization (as defined by the National Immigration Law Center).
