California State University General Education Curriculum
2007 - 2008

The California State University System requires that 48 units of general education must be completed to be eligible for a bachelor's degree. Of these 48 units, 9 units **must** be completed in upper division (junior and senior years) and up to 39 units **may** be completed in lower division (freshman and sophomore years). Students who complete these 39 units of general education at Citrus College will be certified as such when transcripts are sent to a CSU campus. Transfer students are encouraged to complete these requirements at Citrus College. Students who have completed general education courses at other accredited institutions should seek the advice of a counselor regarding the certification of those courses. Acceptable courses are grouped in five areas, A through E. For total certification of 39 units, all of Category A and the Mathematics area of Category B must be completed prior to transfer with grades of C or better. If ineligible from high school to attend CSU, students must complete 60 transferable units, and make up entrance requirement deficiencies. Please see a counselor for entrance requirements and preparation for major requirements. Unit values are indicated by category or are individually specified.
