

Due to changing curricula at this institution and at four-year colleges and universities, students need to make an appointment with a Citrus College counselor to receive the most up-to-date academic information regarding courses to take.

Teacher Education

Students who plan to enter the teaching profession at the elementary or high school level can take their first two years of instruction at Citrus College and then transfer to a four-year university.

Teachers must demonstrate comprehensive knowledge of the subjects they teach, and subject matter preparation can begin at Citrus. For elementary teaching, many general education courses will also apply to subject matter preparation.

In order to avoid duplication of coursework and make the most efficient use of time, students should see a counselor in the Center for Teacher Excellence, located in the ED Building.

California Articulation Number System

COURSES QUALIFIED FEBRUARY, 2004

The California Articulation Number (CAN) System identifies the transferable, lower division, introductory (preparatory) courses commonly taught on California college campuses/. The system assures students that CAN courses on one participating campus will be accepted "in lieu of" comparable CAN courses on another participating campus. For example: CAN ECON 2 on one campus will be accepted for CAN ECON 2 on every other participating campus.

Each campus retains its own numbering system, but adds the CAN designation parenthetically in its publications. Check with counseling offices, academic advising offices, or articulation officers for current listing of CAN courses and campuses participating in the CAN system. A CAN Catalog listing campuses and courses is published annually.
