Want to explore a new field of interest? Want a course not offered at Citrus? Want to check out another college or university? You may be able to cross enroll at a CSU or UC!

What is Cross Enrollment with CSU and UC?

Undergraduate students enrolled at Citrus College may enroll without formal admission and without additional payment of university fees, in a maximum of one course per academic term at a campus of either the CSU or UC system on a space available basis with the approval of the appropriate campus authorities. Enrollment in pre-collegiate courses is excluded.

How do I know if I am qualified?

To qualify for cross enrollment you must meet all of the following requirements:

1. You must be a California resident
2. Completed at least one term at Citrus College
3. Enrolled in a minimum of six units for the current term
4. Earned a grade point average of at least 2.0 (grade of C) for degree applicable work
5. Paid appropriate fees at Citrus for the current term

Where do I get an application?

Get an application from the Admissions and Records office. If you have further questions about cross enrollment please make an appointment to see a counselor or advisor in the Counseling and Advisement Center (626) 914-8530 or the Career/Transfer Center (626) 914-8639.

Enrollment conditions:

1. Approval for cross enrollment is valid for only one term specified and subject to space availability, deadlines, registration procedures and priorities of host campus. You must reapply for each term you cross enroll.
2. You will not be charged additional course enrollment fees. However the host campus (CSU or UC campuses) may charge a \$10 administration fee each term.
3. You will have to pay any additional fees required of other students (labs, materials, breakage, computer, transcript, etc.)
4. Academic advising for students who cross enroll is available only at Citrus College in the Career/Transfer Center.
5. Students are urged to secure approval of the Director of the Career/Transfer Center at Citrus College to ensure course meets Citrus College requirements.
6. Evidence of completion of course prerequisite may be required at time of enrollment (personal transcript copy or grade reports).
7. Financial aid is available only through the home campus, Citrus College. Students eligible for Veterans, Rehabilitation, Social Security and other federal state or county benefits must secure eligibility certification through home campus. Units taken at both campuses may be combined to establish financial aid.
8. The host campus maintains records of credit earned through cross enrollment. Students may request transcripts be sent to Citrus College.

9. Health service on host campus are limited to treatment for emergencies.

10. Because of overlapping academic calendars, cross enrollment is possible only in certain combinations. See the Director of the Career/Transfer Center to find out when cross enrollment is possible.

11. Participation in student activities or use of student union at the CSU or UC campuses is subject to limitations set by the host campus.

12. Parking on the host campus will be available on the basis of a term fee within campus parking availability or on a daily fee basis.

13. Information concerning host campus identification card policies will be provided at registration.

14. Students are subject to all administrative procedures of the host campus. NOTE: Students must process an official drop at the CSU or UC campus or risk having an unsatisfactory grade recorded on permanent record.
