WHAT DO I NEED TO TRANSFER?

Minimum Admission Requirements



General Education (G.E.) -

Complete a minimum of **30 units of G.E.** with a "C" grade or better.

As part of the 30 units of G.E., complete the **Golden Four** courses with a "C" grade or better:

Area A1: Oral Communication Area A2: English Composition Area A3: Critical Thinking

Area B4: Mathematics/Quantitative Reasoning

*If following CSU-GE or IGETC pattern, the 30 units of G.E. and Golden Four will be satisfied.

Major Preparation – Check www.assist.org

Many majors require that you complete specific courses prior to transfer to be eligible or competitive for admission and to help you graduate in a timely manner. Use assist.org to find courses from Citrus College that fulfill major requirements. Always check with a counselor/advisor for questions you have.

Electives -

Additional transferable courses needed to reach the 60-unit admission requirement.

<u>Associate Degrees for Transfer (ADT)</u>

The Associate Degrees for Transfer (ADT) are a type of associate degree offered at California Community Colleges that guarantee admission to the CSU system.

Benefits of Earning an ADT

- Priority admission consideration with junior standing at the CSU system if major is "deemed similar"
- Guaranteed admission to the CSU system (admission to a particular CSU is not guaranteed)
- Complete baccalaureate degree with only 60 additional semester units at the university if program has been deemed similar

Requirements to Complete ADT

- Complete CSUGE or IGETC pattern
- Complete major requirements
- Complete 60 CSU transferable units
- Have 2.00 GPA or higher
- Complete a minimum of 12 units at Citrus College

May



Register for summer/fall classes



March

- Attend the spring semester Transfer Fair
- Schedule appointment with a counselor/advisor to update SEP



February

- Attend as many career/transfer related events and workshops for the semester as possible
- Join a student club/organization on campus, apply for an internship or volunteer work


November



- Ask a counselor/advisor about the Associate Degree for Transfer (ADT)
- Make an appointment with a counselor/advisor to update your Student Education Plan (SEP)
- Register for winter/spring classes

<u>October</u>

- Renew your FAFSA/Dream Act application
- Attend the fall semester Transfer Fair



- If you've attended other colleges, submit official transcripts to A&R
- Attend a Transfer to CSU 101 workshop

September

- Visit the CTC Resource Library to learn about career/transfer resources
- Visit www.assist.org for more information about major preparation
- Participate in university tours





August

- Undecided about a major? Visit the Career/Transfer Center (CTC) for major & career exploration assistance
- Take a career counseling class, i.e., COUN 101 or 145
- Take COUN 158 Transfer Preparation



What You'll Need to Apply:

Transcripts: Have transcripts from all colleges you have attended available and refer to them as you fill out the application.

Test Scores: Have scores for any Advanced Placement (AP), International Baccalaureate (IB), TOEFL or IELTS exams available.

Annual Income for this year and last year (or your parents' income if you are considered dependent).

Application Fee & Fee Waiver: The application fee is \$70 per campus. You may apply for a fee waiver for up to four campuses within the application.

EOP Application: Be prepared to answer 5 short-answer questions and request two letters of recommendation.

Application Filing Periods

Term	Filing Period
Fall admission	October 1 – November 30 of the year before
Spring admission	August 1-31 of the year before

*Students are encouraged to plan for a fall semester transfer as not all CSU's open for spring semester admission.
