Dear Citrus College Students and Colleagues,

I am writing to inform you that the college has recently received information about **five** confirmed cases of Coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19). The COVID-19 cases were present on campus as follows:

- 1) financial aid office on the first floor of the Student Services Building (SS) on Wednesday, January 5 and Thursday, January 6, 2022 between 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.
- 2) Professional Center (second floor) PC 204 and PC 230 on Thursday, January 6, 2022 between 7 a.m. to 2 p.m.
- 3) Professional Center (first floor) PC 112 on Thursday, January 6 and Friday, January 7, 2022 between 8 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.
- 4) Haugh Performing Arts Center and Box Office on Saturday, January 8, 2022 between 10:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.
- 5) Mathematics Building (second floor) MA 222 Thursday, January 6 and Tuesday, January 11, 2022 between 8 a.m. to 11:30 a.m.

Individuals identified as having "close contact," <u>as defined by county guidelines</u>, have been notified. If you believe that you were in "close contact" with someone on campus infected with COVID-19 and have not been notified, please <u>email the Student Health Center at shc@citruscollege.edu</u> for further instructions.

The following guidelines are offered as precautionary measures:

- Wear a face covering (mask) as currently required by the County of Los Angeles Department of Public Health while indoors regardless of vaccination status.
- Stay home when you are sick. Anyone with symptoms consistent with COVID-19 should remain at home in isolation for a minimum of 10 days plus at least three days after the resolution of fever (without fever-reducing medication) and improvement in other symptoms. District provided COVID-19 sick leave (80 hours) is available to full-time employees in addition to regular sick leave.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. If soap and water are not available, use alcohol-based hand sanitizers that contain at least 60% alcohol.

- Cover your coughs and sneezes with a tissue, and then dispose of the tissue and clean your hands immediately. If you do not have a tissue, use your sleeve, not your hands, to cover your coughs and sneezes.
- Limit close contact with people who are sick, and avoid sharing food, drinks or utensils.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces using a regular household cleaning spray or wipes.
