I hope that you, your family and your friends are doing well and staying safe. As we prepare to begin our spring 2022 semester, I wanted to take a moment to provide you with a few important collegewide updates.

First, I want to commend each of you for your efforts throughout the fall semester and winter session. I am so proud of what we have been able to accomplish by working together in service to our students. One example of this outstanding teamwork on campus was the massive cleanup effort that took place last month following the heavy winds in our region. Our grounds crew did a phenomenal job repairing damage from a wind storm that toppled trees, broke branches and uprooted plants. To our grounds crew and everyone on campus who makes a difference – thank you!

As we welcome more students and staff on campus, I want to remind the campus community – including those who may be returning for the first time since the pandemic – that health and safety remain a top priority. Our extensive COVID-19 measures – from weekly testing to daily health screenings – will remain in effect, as outlined in the recent human resources memo you received. Additionally, the college is working in collaboration with the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health to host two additional vaccine clinics on Friday, February 25, and Friday, March 18.
