Creating an equitable and inclusive learning and working environment for the Citrus College community is one of my top priorities as a superintendent/president.

In 2020, the Citrus Community College District Board of Trustees unanimously adopted a resolution to address structural racism and champion equity in all college matters. Since then, the college has formed a Diversity, Equity and Inclusion (DEI) Task Force with the charge of assessing the college's policies, plans, curriculum and the campus environment – both inside and outside the classroom.

The DEI Task Force has conducted an analysis, developed DEI toolkits, and collected student and employee surveys on DEI. Additionally, in April 2022, the college hired its first director of DEI, Tyesha Thomas. The DEI Task Force co-chairs and Ms. Thomas will be presenting the Task Force's findings and plans for the future at the June 21 board meeting.

I invite you to spend time this weekend honoring Juneteenth by reflecting on our nation's history of inequality and the meaning of true freedom, as we work together to shape a better future.
