*** SEXUAL BATTERY ***

TO THE CITRUS COLLEGE COMMUNITY

FEBRUARY 26, 2018

In compliance with the "Timely Warning" provisions of the federal Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crimes Statistics Act of 1998, the Department of Campus Safety is giving notice of a sexual battery occurring off campus, in the city of Azusa. The purpose of this Timely Warning is to raise campus awareness as it is the duty of the institution to warn the community of these conditions.

Azusa Pacific University (APU) Campus Safety informed the Department of Campus Safety that on Sunday, February 25, 2018 at approximately 10:00 p.m., they received a report of a sexual battery that occurred in the 800 block of East Alosta Avenue in Azusa. According to the victim, they were standing outside when the suspect approached them and sexually groped them. The suspect then fled the area on foot, southbound toward Alosta Avenue.

The Azusa Police Department (APD) is investigating the incident. If you have any information regarding this incident, please contact APD at (626) 812-3200.

SUSPECT INFORMATION:

The suspect is described as a Caucasian male adult, approximately 6'0" tall, 24-27 years old, with red or blond facial hair, wearing all dark clothing. The suspect had the hood from his jacket pulled over his head and was possibly wearing a gray beanie. There was no vehicle seen during the commission of the crime.

SAFETY TIPS

- Program the phone number for **Campus Safety** into your phone **(626) 914-8611**.
- Report any unusual or suspicious activity to Campus Safety immediately. Reports can be made via phone call to Campus Safety or via text by utilizing the text-a-tip function on the **Campus Safety mobile app, Citrus Guardian**.
- **When possible, avoid walking alone. Walk with a friend or walk in well-traveled areas.**
- **If on campus, utilize the safety escort services provided by Campus Safety.**
- **Stay in well lighted areas.**
- **Avoid places where you are vulnerable and there are no exits.**
- **Be aware of people around you. When you are walking, stay alert and tuned into your surroundings.**
- **Walk with confidence; show that you are aware and in control.**
- If you are being followed, go to the nearest business or residence for help.
- If you are harassed by the occupants of a car, turn and walk in the other direction. The driver will have to turn around to follow you.

If you see something, say something. Safety is everyone's business.
