Assault with a Deadly Weapon

TO THE CITRUS COLLEGE COMMUNITY

May 24, 2019

In compliance with the "Timely Warning" provisions of the federal Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crimes Statistics Act of 1998, the Department of Campus Safety is giving notice of an assault occurring off campus, but in the vicinity of the college. The purpose of this Timely Warning is to raise campus awareness as it is the duty of the institution to warn the community of these conditions.

On Thursday, May 23, 2019 at 2:19 pm, the Azusa Pacific University (APU) Department of Campus Safety received information from the Azusa Police Department (AzPD) regarding a physical altercation occurring near their campus. The information detailed an assault with a deadly weapon on the public sidewalk of Alostia Avenue, near the Alostia Place Apartments (1130 E. Alostia Avenue, Azusa); where three male suspects approached a female victim and stabbed her with a sharp object while calling her racial slurs. AzPD responded and searched for the suspects who were last seen fleeing the area in different directions. APU Campus Safety advised the female victim was non-APU affiliated and also stated the suspects were non-APU affiliated. The victim was transported to a local hospital and is in stable condition. APU Campus Safety stated at this time there is no present or immediate threat to the APU Community and urged anyone who may have witnessed the above-described incident, to call the Azusa Police Department at (626) 812-3200.

Three male Hispanics – ages 18-25 years

SAFETY TIPS

- Program the phone number for Campus Safety into your phone (626) 914-8611.
- Report any unusual or suspicious activity to Campus Safety immediately. Reports can be made via phone call to Campus Safety or via text by utilizing the text-a-tip function on the Campus Safety mobile app, Citrus Guardian.
- **When possible, avoid walking alone. Walk with a friend or walk in well-traveled areas.**
- **If on campus, utilize the safety escort services provided by Campus Safety.**
- **Stay in well lighted areas.**
- **Avoid places where you are vulnerable and there are no exits.**
- **Be aware of people around you. When you are walking, stay alert and tuned into your surroundings.**
- **Walk with confidence; show that you are aware and in control.**
- If you are being followed, go to the nearest business or residence for help.
- If you are harassed by the occupants of a car, turn and walk in the other direction. The driver will have to turn around to follow you.

If you see something, say something. Safety is everyone's business.
