*** INDECENT EXPOSURE ***

TO THE CITRUS COLLEGE COMMUNITY

November 2, 2018

In compliance with the "Timely Warning" provisions of the federal Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crimes Statistics Act of 1998, the Department of Campus Safety is giving notice of indecent exposure reported to have occurred on campus. The purpose of this Timely Warning is to raise campus awareness as it is the duty of the institution to warn the community of this incident.

On Thursday, November 1, 2018 at approximately 4:20 p.m., a female student reported an indecent exposure incident that occurred a few minutes prior in the S6 parking lot. The student stated that as she sat in her vehicle in the S6 parking lot, an unknown male pulled up alongside her and parked his vehicle next to hers. When she looked his way, she saw the unknown male's arm moving up and down near his lap. The student stated she yelled at the male and he subsequently lifted his torso and exposed himself to her. The student immediately left the area and reported the incident to Campus Safety. The student was not physically injured during the incident.

SUSPECT INFORMATION:

Suspect Description:

Hispanic male, light skin, mid 20s, dark curly hair to his jawline, slim build, no facial hair and wore a dark ball cap;

Vehicle Description:

Black, compact, newer model, sedan with a spoiler.

SAFETY TIPS

- Program the phone number for Campus Safety into your phone (626) 914-8611.
- Report any unusual or suspicious activity to Campus Safety immediately. Reports can be made via phone call to Campus Safety or via text by utilizing the text-a-tip function on the **Campus Safety mobile app, Citrus Guardian.**
- **Be aware of people around you and stay alert to your surroundings.**
- **When possible, avoid walking alone. Walk with a friend or walk in well-traveled areas.**
- **If on campus, utilize the safety escort services provided by Campus Safety.**
- Stay in well lighted areas.
- Avoid places where you are vulnerable and there are no exits.
- Walk with confidence; show that you are aware and in control.
- If you are being followed, go to the nearest classroom, building, business or residence for help.
- If you are harassed by the occupants of a car, turn and walk in the other direction. The driver will have to turn around to follow you.
