Dear Citrus College Colleagues,

I am writing to inform you that the college has recently received information about a confirmed case of Coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) in at least one employee who was on campus on January 6 and 7, 2021. Those who may have been in the area or had contact with the individual have been notified, and cleaning and disinfecting of the exposed location are in progress. If you had any contact with any employee or student on either January 6 or 7, 2021 in rooms TC 228, 229, 230 or PC 212, 230 and you have not already been contacted by the college, please let me know via email, rsammis@citruscollege.edu, and I will provide you with further instructions.

The following guidelines are offered as precautionary measures:

How You Can Help

Be proactive about reducing the number of interactions with individuals by practicing physical (or social) distancing (staying at least six feet apart) to limit the spread of Coronavirus 19. In addition to physical distancing, another important tool to prevent the spread of Coronavirus 19 is to practice good hygiene. Important public health prevention messages include:

- Stay home when you are sick. Anyone with symptoms consistent with COVID-19 should remain at home
 in isolation for a minimum of 10 days plus at least three days after the resolution of fever (without feverreducing medication) and improvement in other symptoms.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. If soap and water are not available, use alcohol-based hand sanitizers that contain at least 60% alcohol.
- Cover your coughs and sneezes with a tissue, and then dispose of the tissue and clean your hands immediately. If you do not have a tissue, use your sleeve, not your hands, to cover your coughs and sneezes.
- Limit close contact with people who are sick, and avoid sharing food, drinks, or utensils.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces using a regular household cleaning spray or wipes.
- Wear a mask or face covering consistent with state and county guidelines.
