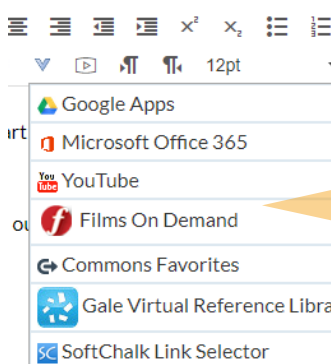
The External Tools icon looks like a "v" and will open a drop down menu.

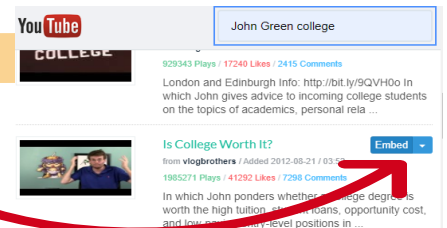

Record/Upload Media

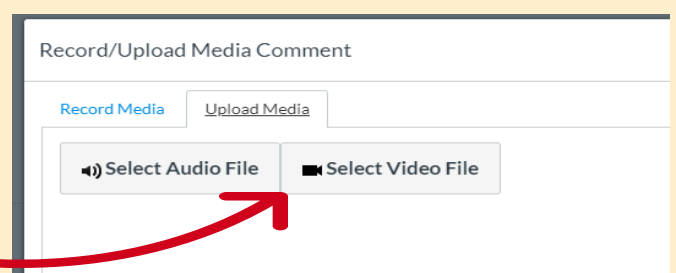
- 2 Using the editing tools on any page, quiz, or assignment, select the option for "Record/Upload Media."

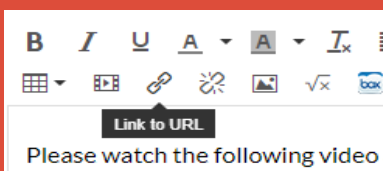

The pop-out allows you to record directly to the page or to upload your Mp4 or Mp.3 file.



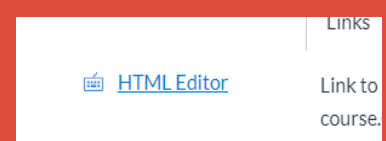
Embed links or HTML
