

WHAT DO I NEED TO TRANSFER?

Minimum Admission Requirements



UC Transfer Admission Planner (TAP)

UC TAP is an online tool that helps you **plan** your coursework from the very beginning of your college career or at any point when you decide to transfer to a UC. The planner lets you **track** your progress towards meeting UC minimum admission requirements and allows UC staff to communicate important information about transfer to prospective students.

UC Transfer Admission Guarantee (TAG)

Davis • Irvine • Merced • Riverside • Santa Barbara • Santa Cruz

The TAG program offers qualified California Community College students guaranteed admission to one of the six participating UC campuses. The requirements to be eligible for TAG vary by campus, check with a Citrus College counselor/advisor for details.

Applying for TAG -

- 1. Create a TAP account
- 2. Complete and submit the TAG application between September 1-30
- 3. Submit the UC application between October 1 November 30

General Education (G.E.) -

Complete the following seven-course pattern with a "C" grade or better.

2 UC transferable English composition courses

1 UC transferable mathematical concepts and quantitative reasoning course

4 courses from at least two of the following areas:

Arts & Humanities Social & Behavioral Science Physical & Biological Science

*If following IGETC, the seven course pattern will be satisfied.

Major Preparation - Check www.assist.org

Many majors require that you complete specific courses prior to transfer to be eligible or competitive for admission and to help you graduate in a timely manner. Use assist.org to find courses from Citrus College that fulfill major requirements. Always check with a counselor/advisor for questions you have.

Transfer Roadmap – My First Year at Citrus College

February

<u>May</u>

• Register for summer/fall classes

<u>March</u>

- Attend the spring semester Transfer Fair
- Schedule an appointment with a counselor/advisor to update your SEP
- Attend as many career/transfer related events and
- workshops for the semester as possible
- Join a student club/organization on campus, apply for an internship or volunteer work

November

- Make an appointment with a counselor/advisor to update your Student Education Plan (SEP)
- Ask a counselor/advisor about the TAG program
- Visit assist.org for more information about major preparation
- Register for winter/spring classes

October

- Renew your FAFSA/Dream Act application
- Attend the fall semester Transfer Fair
- Schedule appointments to meet with university representatives
- Start your UC TAP account
- If you've attended other colleges, submit official transcripts to A&R

September

- Participate in university tours
- Attend a Transfer to UC 101 workshop
- Visit the CTC Resource Library to learn about career/transfer resources

August



- Undecided about a major? Visit the Career/Transfer
 - Center (CTC) for major & career exploration assistance
- Take a career counseling class, i.e. COUN 101 or 145
- Take COUN 158 Transfer Preparation

What You'll Need to Apply:

Transcripts: Have transcripts from all colleges you have attended available and refer to them as you fill out the application.

Test Scores: You'll need to include scores for any Advanced Placement (AP), International Baccalaureate (IB), TOEFL or IELTS exams if applicable.

Annual Income for current and last year (your parents' income if you are considered dependent).

Activities and Awards: Gather information about awards you have received or extracurricular activities you have been involved with.

Application Fee & Fee Waiver: The application fee is \$80 per campus (\$95 for international applicants). You may apply for a fee waiver for up to four campuses within the application.

Application Filing Periods

Term	Filing Period
Fall admission	October 1-November 30
(Application opens	of the year before
August 1)	
Winter /Spring	July 1-31 of the year
admission	before

*Students are encouraged to plan for a fall semester transfer as not all UC's open for winter quarter/spring semester admission.
