

## Comparing Students Enrolled in Fall 2018 vs Fall 2017: An Executive Summary

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### A. Comparison of the fall 2018 vs. fall 2017 headcount as of the fall census day:

- Fall headcounts dropped **234** from 13,473 in fall 2017 to 13,239 in fall 2018
- Comparing to fall 2017, Hispanic students increased slightly (43 students). African American students had the biggest drop in that fall 2018 and fall 18 is only 89% of fall 2017's size: a drop of 58 African American students. White students also dropped by 138 students.
- There is an increase (238 more students) in the 19 or younger age group, mostly due to the CCAP expansion at the local high schools. Similarly, concurrent enrollment in the HS increased 32%, an increase of 102 students from 320 to 422. Students in the age group 20-24 dropped 427 from 5,590 to 5,163.
- By student type, first-time students had the biggest increase (26%) from 1,530 to 1,931. On the contrary, continuing students had the biggest drop (8%) with a loss of 658 students.
- In general, we have more full-time students on campus this fall as compared to last fall. Students' average unit load increased slightly from 9.50 to 9.54 units.

### B. Examining students from the previous spring semesters

Comparing Spring 18 to Spring 17, the college graduated **132** more students, which explains about half of the 234 student headcounts dropped from fall 17 to fall 18.

The students who fall into the category ‘8-None of the above’ are further investigated. Again, these **1,709** students are the ones who

- Are not dismissed
- Are eligible for financial aid
- Are not in high school/concurrent enrollment program
- Have never received any degree from Citrus College
- Did not owe more than \$100 to the college
- Are not on probation

IRPE plans to submit their information to the National Student Clearinghouse later in fall to find out if they are enrolled in other colleges. These 1,709 students seem to be the group who we should target for outreach intervention.
