Dear Citrus College Students and Colleagues,

I am writing to inform you that the college has recently received information about a confirmed case of Coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) present on campus. The COVID-19 exposure occurred on campus on the following date(s) and location(s):

- 1. Physical Education Building (PE 101) on Monday, February 7, 2022 and Tuesday, February 8, 2022 from 7:17 a.m. to 9:15 a.m.
- 2. Liberal Arts/Business Building (LB 307) on Monday, February 7, 2022 and Tuesday, February 8, 2022 from 10:25 a.m. to 11:30 a.m.

Individuals identified as having "close contact," as defined by county guidelines, have been notified. If you believe that you were in "close contact" with someone on campus infected with COVID-19 and have not been notified, please email the Student Health Center at <a href="mailto:shc@citruscollege.edu">shc@citruscollege.edu</a> for further instructions.

The following guidelines are offered as precautionary measures:

- Wear a face covering (mask) as currently required by the County of Los Angeles Department of Public Health while indoors regardless of vaccination status.
- Stay home when you are sick. Anyone with symptoms consistent with COVID-19 should remain at home
  in isolation for a minimum of 10 days plus at least three days after the resolution of fever (without
  fever-reducing medication) and improvement in other symptoms. District provided COVID-19 sick leave
  (80 hours) is available to full-time employees in addition to regular sick leave.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. If soap and water are not available, use alcohol-based hand sanitizers that contain at least 60% alcohol.
- Cover your coughs and sneezes with a tissue, and then dispose of the tissue and clean your hands immediately. If you do not have a tissue, use your sleeve, not your hands, to cover your coughs and sneezes.
- Limit close contact with people who are sick, and avoid sharing food, drinks or utensils.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces using a regular household cleaning spray or wipes.
