### Message to Our Community



On behalf of the Measure G Citizens Oversight Committee, I am pleased to present the 2017 Annual Report to the community. This publication is one of several accountability measures put in place to ensure voters are kept apprised of their investment in Citrus College and its students. In addition to demonstrating that tax dollars have been allocated carefully, the report provides examples of how Measure G has enabled the college to increase student success.

Nearly 14 years have passed since the voters of the Citrus Community College District approved the Measure G general obligation bond

measure. This visionary decision has allowed Citrus College to construct and renovate facilities and rehabilitate aging infrastructure. As a result, thousands of students have received access to innovative educational opportunities and student support services that empower them to complete their college education.

For more than a decade, the Measure G Citizens Oversight Committee has represented the voice of local residents and taxpayers. Appointed by the Citrus Community College District Board of Trustees, committee members are asked to serve up to two consecutive two-year terms. They represent local organizations, the community, the college's Foundation and the Citrus College student body. Together, the committee's seven members monitor expenditures for compliance with the voter-approved ballot measure, and review the financial and performance audits conducted by an independent certified public accounting firm.

For the fiscal year that ended on June 30, 2017, Vavrinek, Trine, Day & Co., LLP, performed the Measure G audits that included an examination of the district's compliance with the financial and performance requirements of the Proposition 39 Measure G General Obligation bond program, as specified in section 1(b)(3)(c) of Article XIIIA of the California Constitution. The committee is happy to report that the audit did not contain any findings. The auditors concluded that the district's Measure G financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Citrus Community College District Measure G General Obligation Bond Construction Fund as of June 30, 2017.

A walk through Citrus College will reveal that many improvements have been made to the campus over the past several years. During 2017, in addition to continuing construction and planning for the remaining Measure G modernization projects, the committee was especially excited to see the completion of the modernization of Hayden Hall, a 4,200-square-foot facility that is the district's oldest building. Of course, the impact of Measure G goes much further than brick and mortar. While your support has changed the physical landscape of the college, it has more importantly changed the lives and destinies of thousands of students.

On behalf of the Measure G Citizens Oversight Committee, I extend my gratitude to you, the members of the Citrus Community College District's communities, for your continued investment in the future of your community college. I also commend Citrus College's leadership and staff for their conscientious management in maximizing Measure G dollars.

As demonstrated by this Annual Report, the significance of Measure G cannot be overstated. The improved facilities, new buildings and upgraded infrastructure made possible by the support of the voters of the Citrus Community College District will continue to play a significant role in increasing the level of excellence of Citrus College among the nation's community colleges.
