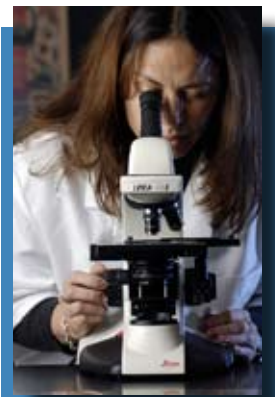

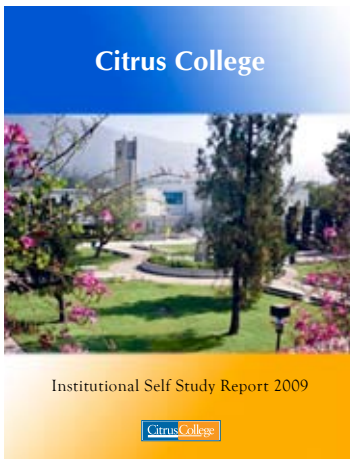
# MILESTONES AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Members of the Citrus College community were busy and productive during the 2008-2009 academic year. As a result, the college met each of its goals, which included completing the Accreditation Self Study, preparing for emergencies, continuing facilities projects, and increasing community outreach.

## ACCREDITATION

Accreditation is defined as a “uniquely American quality assurance process” that establishes the caliber of an educational institution and encourages its improvement. During this process, an institution undergoes periodic evaluation of its programs and services through self study and peer review.

Citrus College, which received affirmation of its accreditation in 2004, completed an 18-month Self Study process that involved faculty, students, staff, and board members. The Self Study was



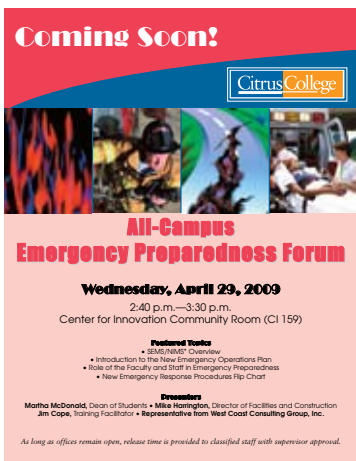
done in preparation for a four-day visit in October by a team from the Accrediting Commission

for Community and Junior Colleges (ACCJC) of the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC). The team was comprised of community college faculty and administrators from across the state.

Citrus’ Accreditation Self Study was a comprehensive analysis that focused on four major standards: institutional mission and effectiveness, student learning programs and services, resources (human, physical, technical, and financial), and governance and leadership.

## EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

Over 60 staff members completed intensive emergency preparedness training and are now compliant with the National Incident Management System (NIMS) and the state Standardized Emergency Management System (SEMS). Members of the Board of Trustees completed emergency preparedness training for community college trustees. The college also launched a campus-wide emergency alert system and conducted safety forums and drills for the college community.



## COMMUNITY RELATIONS

Citrus College worked in earnest to strengthen relationships with potential students and their families; K-12 educators; members of the business community and elected officials. College administrators and staff hosted tours for community leaders and elected officials. An Education Summit and a Green Jobs Summit were among the many other events hosted by the college.

# STUDENT PROFILE

More than 13,000 students were enrolled at Citrus College in fall 2008, a 6 percent increase over the previous year.

## THE CLASS OF 2009

Over 800 students received associate degrees and certificates of achievement. The class of 2009 was a diverse group of students known for its scholastic achievements.

- 259 students graduated with Honors (3.3 to 3.59 GPA), High Honors (3.6 to 3.79 GPA), or Highest Honors (3.8 to 4.0 GPA)

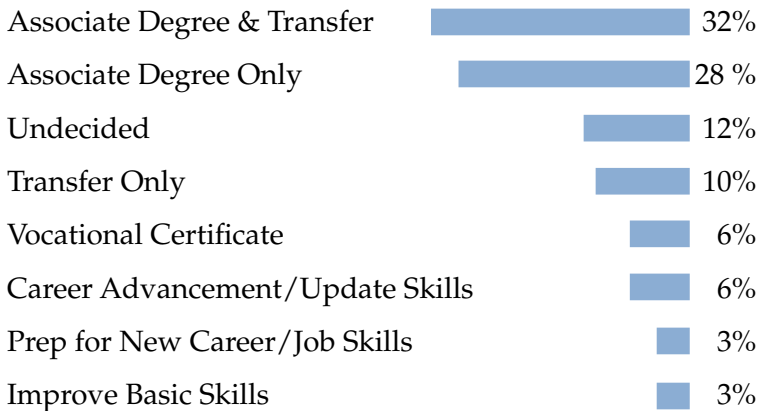

## TOP 100

### CITRUS COLLEGE NAMED TOP PRODUCER BY NATIONAL PUBLICATION

Citrus College was named one of the nation's top degree and certificate producing two-year institutions by *Community College Week* magazine. The college ranked in the top 100 colleges in the following categories.

### 2009 DISTINGUISHED FACULTY: CAROLYN PERRY

Professor Carolyn Perry's passion for student success and academic achievement has earned her Citrus College's 2009 Distinguished Faculty honor.

A full-time instructor since 1997, Mrs. Perry has been very instrumental in creating and implementing many Citrus College programs, many of them targeting honor students. She was also instrumental in establishing Citrus College's Center for Teacher Excellence and was a major force in creating the college's associate degree program in Child Development. Her involvement at Citrus College also includes membership on the Staff Development Committee and the Academic Senate.



### \$3.4 MILLION GRANT PREPARES FUTURE SCIENTISTS AND MATHEMATICIANS

The U.S. Department of Education awarded Citrus College a two-year grant of over \$3.4 million to increase the number and success of underrepresented students in the majors of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM). The funding established programs designed to further student interest in the STEM fields and increase the number of students who transfer to four-year colleges and universities as STEM majors.



### GREEN TEAM PRESENTS EARTH DAY EVENT

The Citrus College Green Team was the driving force behind the college's 2009 Earth Day event, a campus and community celebration that featured over 50 displays and 11 workshops. The keynote speaker was award-winning scientist and conservationist Dr. Biruté M.F. Galdikas, the world's foremost authority on the orangutan, who spoke on the topic "Going Green by Saving Orangutans and the Tropical Forest."

## STUDENTS HEAR “LESSONS FROM LITTLE ROCK”

The Student Services and Student Life divisions presented Dr. Terrence Roberts, one of the nine students who integrated Central High School in Little Rock, Arkansas. His lecture, “Lessons from Little Rock,” described how his experience in 1957 helped to change American society.

Adrienne Thompson, student activities supervisor commented, “The purpose of this presentation was to remind people of how far our society has come in terms of ensuring equal rights.”



## VETERANS CENTER DEDICATED

Citrus College celebrated the opening of its Veterans Center, made possible by a \$100,000 Wal-Mart Foundation grant. The center will serve as a headquarters for the college Veterans Program, and provide support services such as GI Bill processing and information; the Veterans Network student club; peer-to-peer support groups, workshops; and the coordination of Veterans Affairs services. The Veterans Center enables Citrus to serve the needs of a growing student veteran population.



## ASCC GIFT ENSURES A MORE SECURE CAMPUS

The Associated Students of Citrus College (ASCC) made it possible for the Security Office to acquire a 2009 Ford Ranger truck, which will be used to patrol the main campus and the remote parking areas located off campus, as well as enforce parking regulations. The truck is also equipped with siren and enunciator capabilities that will enable it to respond to emergency calls.

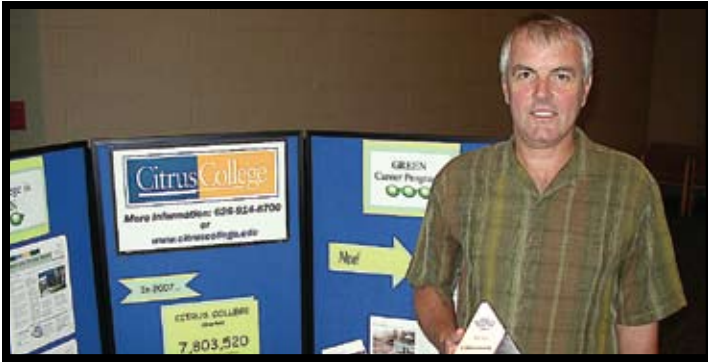


*Savannah Star Dominguez*

## COLLEGE WINS ENVIRONMENTAL AWARD

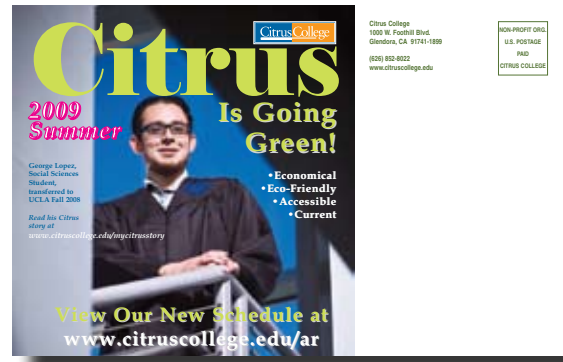
Citrus College received the Irwindale Chamber of Commerce's Solid Waste Reduction Award for diverting 7,803,520 pounds of solid waste to be recycled or reused. This waste includes paper, cartridges, e-waste, and demolished building materials, representing 79.4% of all campus waste for the year.

Jeff Eichler, Environmental Health Supervisor, leads the reduction and recycling efforts at the college.



## FISCAL PLANNING REFLECTS PRUDENT DECISION MAKING

As California's public institutions and agencies grappled with the challenges presented by the budget crisis, the Citrus College community was prudent in preparing for the fiscal downturn. Faculty and staff at all levels devised ways to reduce costs, while maintaining access for as many students as possible. Students, faculty and staff were kept informed of changes in the state and the college budget through a series of timely and informative budget updates and all-campus budget forums.



## ONLINE SCHEDULE DEBUTS

Citrus College no longer prints and mails 85,000 copies of its credit class schedule to district residents three times a year. Instead, the schedule is entirely online and district households receive a postcard reminding them to access the schedule from the college's website. In addition, the online schedule is updated daily and reflects changes in class location, times, seat availability, and faculty assignments.

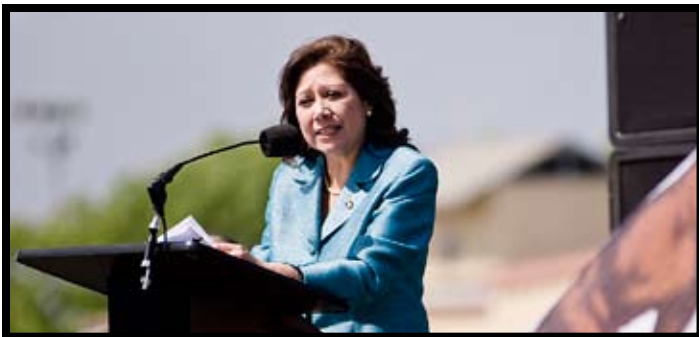

Citrus College was one of several local colleges that presented the "Pathways to Success: Achieving Goals through Education" celebration in honor of U.S. Secretary of Labor Hilda L. Solis. The event was held at La Puente High School, Solis' Alma Mater. 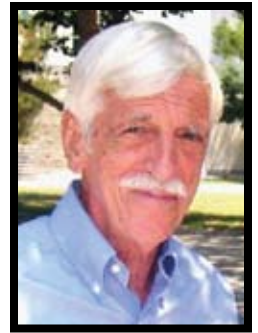
## PROFESSOR EMERITUS TAKES HELM AS NEW FOUNDATION PRESIDENT

A graduate of Fullerton Community College, San Jose State University, and the University of Pacific, Dr. Gallo taught at San Jose State University, Cabrillo College, University of Pacific, and at Foothill College. He is the co-author of a textbook, "Shaping College Writing," which published four editions. Dr. Gallo wrote a non-fiction book, "The House on Garden Street," an account of the 1919 murder of a police officer (his own grandfather) in Kenosha, Wisconsin in 1919.
