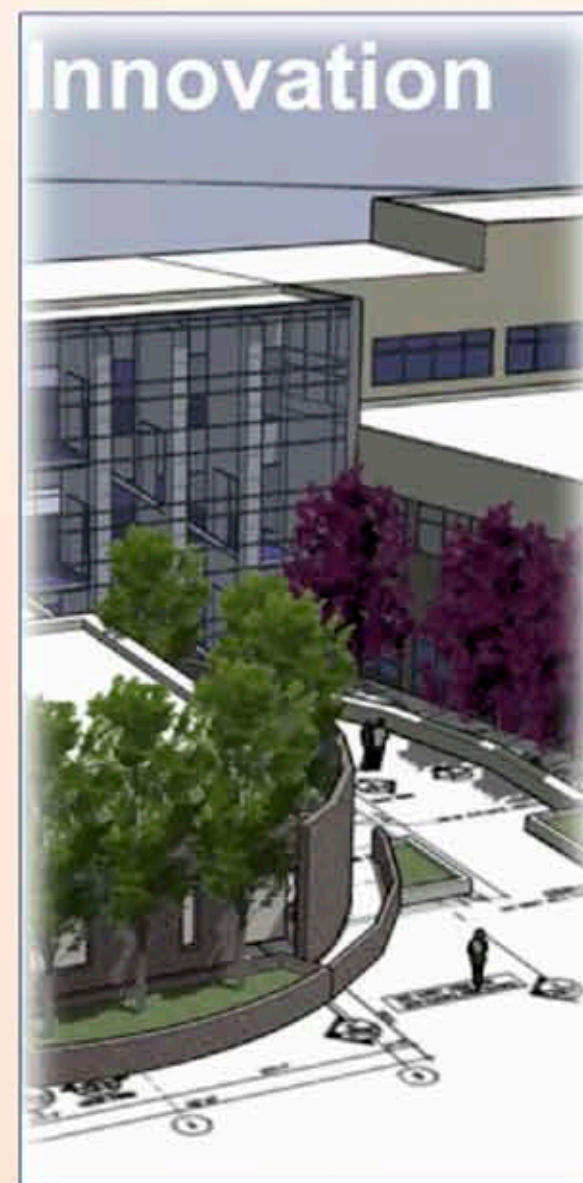
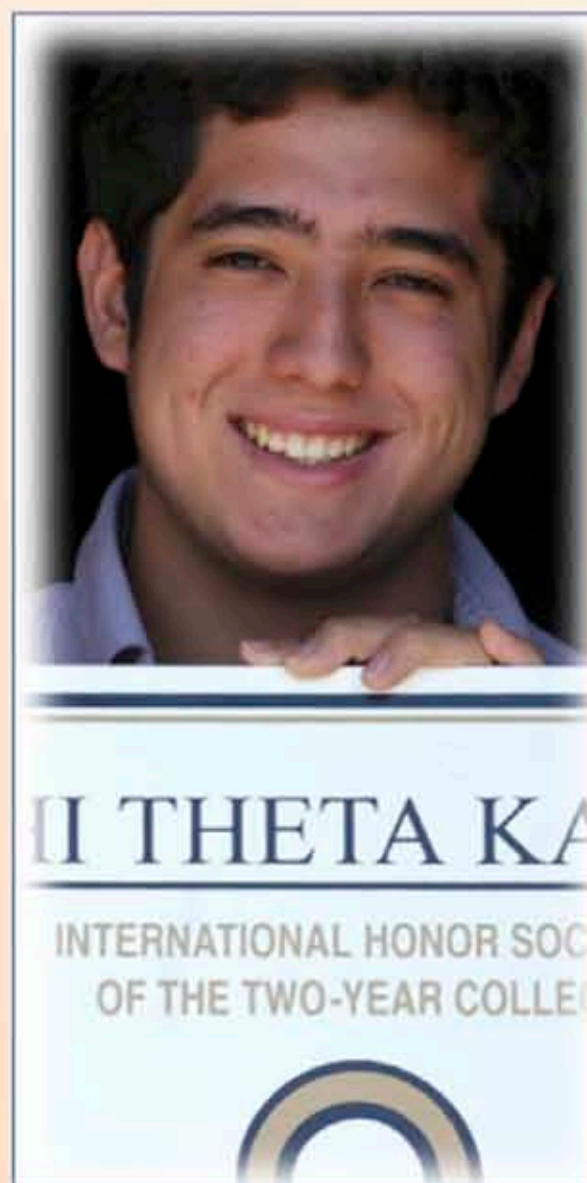

Citrus College's 2005-2006 academic year was highlighted by the development and enhancement of several academic programs.

FRESHMAN EXPERIENCE

Freshman Experience, developed for implementation in fall 2006, is a program designed to give freshman students a "jump start" on college success. Utilizing the concept of "learning communities," students are assigned to cohort groups and take two classes: English, math or counseling classes, together. Two instructors teach the same classes the entire year.

HONORS PROGRAM

The Honors Program was widely promoted on campus and in the high schools, providing small class sizes, priority registration, intensive and challenging classes, and enhanced scholarship opportunities. Guaranteed transfer agreements with several University of California and California State University campuses, as well as some private colleges, are offered. As a result, total student participation in the Honors Program increased 85%.

CENTER FOR INNOVATION

The Center for Innovation, which began construction during the summer of 2006, will serve as an important facility for instruction, providing faculty offices, classrooms, a meeting center and offices for student and campus support programs. This building is fully funded from the Measure G bond passed in 2004.

CITRUS COLLEGE FOUNDATION SUPPORTS STUDENT SUCCESS

The Citrus College Foundation awarded 171 scholarships and grants, valued at over \$170,000 to students in 2006, allowing them to receive the instruction necessary for them to accomplish their goals.

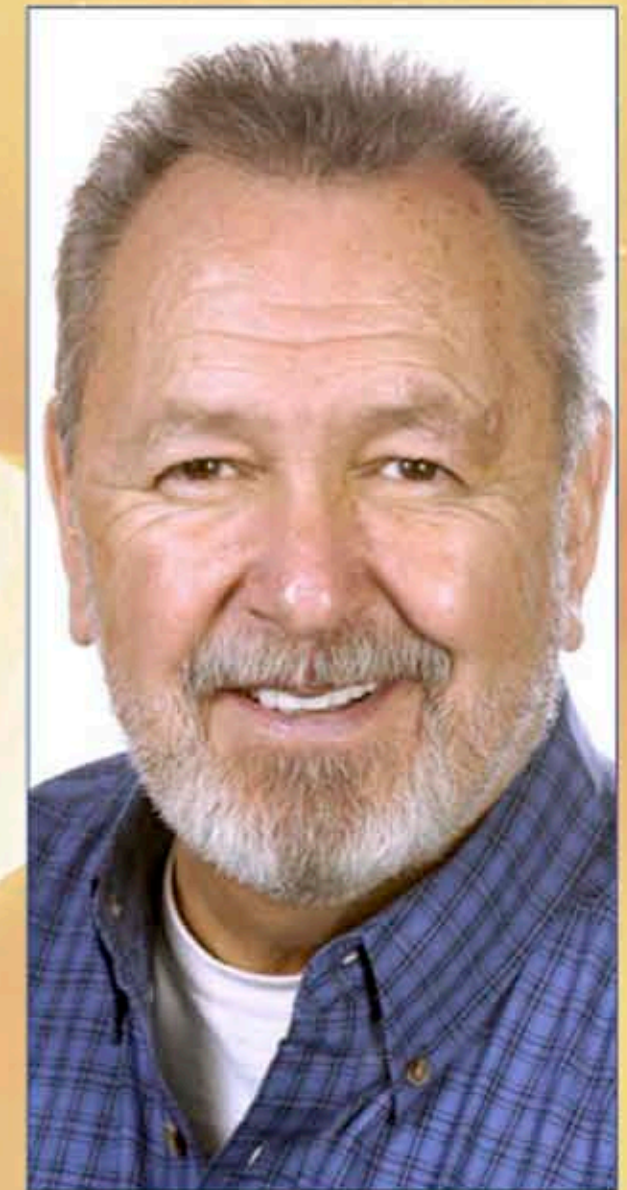

In addition to her current position as an instructor, she has served as Learning Center director and institutional researcher. As chair of the Curriculum Committee, Van Citters was instrumental in writing the Title V federal grant that earned Citrus College its Hispanic Serving Institution designation. Van Citters is the author of an educational CD, "The Reading Road Trip," and a recently published textbook, *College Reading Choices and Challenges*.

2005-2006 TENURED FACULTY ALBERT GRAZIANO COSMETOLOGY INSTRUCTOR

Albert Graziano's career is a creative composite of art, fashion, cosmetology and education. He worked as a fashion stylist, owned a hair salon, worked in the motion picture industry and was an adjunct instructor at Riverside, Fullerton and Citrus colleges. Graziano, who was hired as a full time faculty member in 2003, represents his department in the Academic Senate and on the Curriculum Committee. He is also involved, along with his students, in the Foothill Unity Center's annual *Back to School* program.

The Emergency Medical Technical Program (EMT) placed 100% of its students into full time positions with local ambulance services. The EMT program also qualifies students for national certification from the National Registry.

The Automotive Technology division was one of six schools in the US receiving the T-TEN School Recognition Award from Toyota Motor Sales, USA. NEW SYSTEMS INCREASES TECHNICAL EFFICIENCY

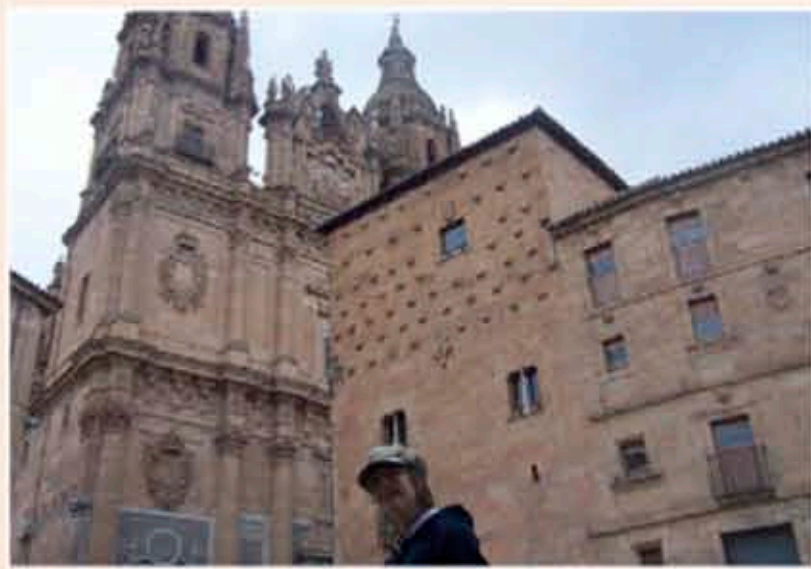

In 2005-2006, while students spent semesters in London, Spain, Austria and Italy, Citrus administrators, faculty and staff made plans for a Study Abroad program in China, slated for Summer 2007.

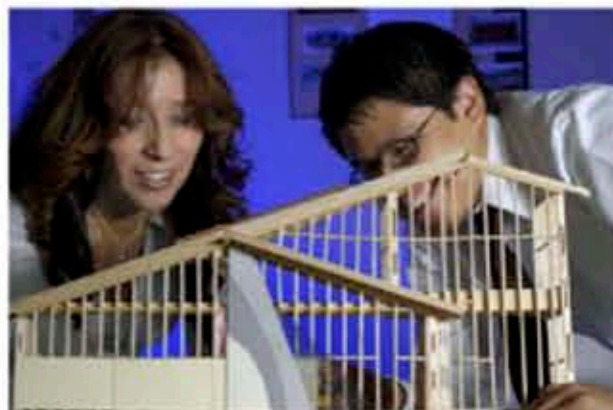

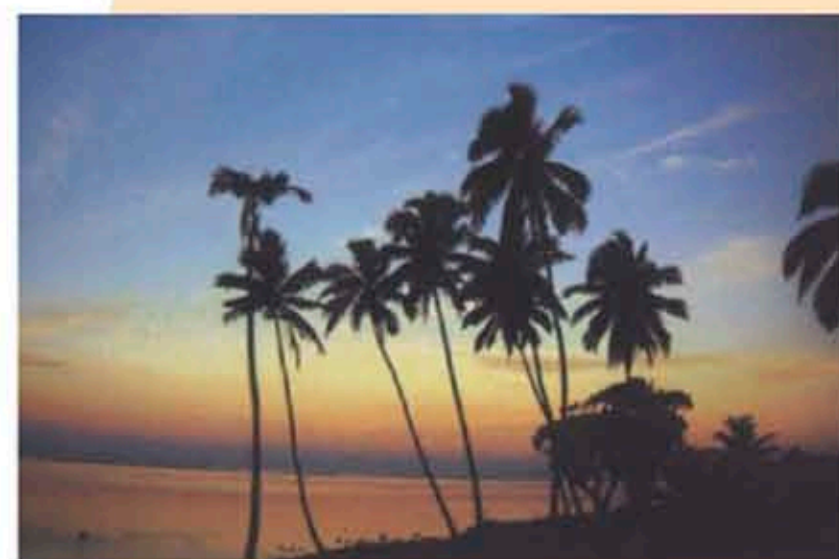

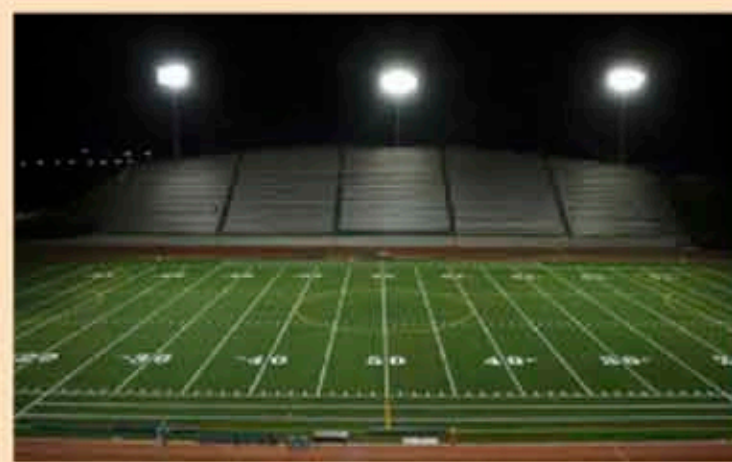

Our Building Projects Also Win Awards

The Citrus College Stadium lighting renovation project received an award for Electrical Excellence in the Outdoor Lighting Category from the local chapter of the National Electrical Contractors Association (LANECA). Southern California Edison was instrumental in the implementation and completion of this project.

Citrus College and Southern California Edison have collaborated to enhance additional energy efficiency measures. These measures include replacing outdated air conditioning systems, installing occupancy sensing and controls interface, and substituting fluorescent lighting for incandescent lighting.



When these projects are completed, Citrus College will earn over \$300,000 in rebates and will save over 1 million kilowatt hours a year in monthly energy charges.

Center for Innovation

Construction Start Date—May 2006 with a 20 month construction process. This three-story building will feature faculty offices, a multimedia center, open areas for part-time instructors, four suites for academic deans, a teleconferencing center, and offices of the Citrus College Foundation, Office of External Relations and various student programs.

Central Plant

Construction Start Date—June 2006 with a 12 month construction process. The Central Plant will deliver heated and chilled water for heating and air conditioning systems throughout campus, thermal energy storage to reduce peak energy consumption and additional capacity to service all existing and future buildings.

Field House

Estimated Construction Start Date—May 2007 with a 13 month construction process. This single-story building will offer convenient facilities to support football, baseball, soccer and track; men's shower/locker rooms, offices, team rooms, concessions, equipment storage and restrooms.

Security Building

Estimated Construction Start Date—May 2007 with a 12 month construction process. This single-story 2000 square foot building will house the Security Department offices, locker room for security officers, storage for security vehicles and a drive-up window to purchase parking permits.

Vocational Technology Building

Estimated Construction Start Date—June 2007 with a 23 month construction process. This single-story building will be the new location for Auto Technology, Vocational Education, Criminal Justice and the online library. This project is state funded.

Student Services Building

Estimated Construction Start Date—Summer of 2008. This two-story 58,000 square foot building will house the TECs Department, Admissions and Records, Financial Aid, Job Placement, Counseling, Career/Transfer Center, Non Credit Matriculation, EOPS, Disabled Students, Student Activities/Student Affairs, Service Learning, Student Health Center, Bookstore Express, International Students, Vice President's Office, shared meeting rooms and an event venue.

Fine Arts Building

Estimated Construction Start Date—Fall of 2010
 Plans are underway for a new facility housing Fine Arts, Communications and Photography.

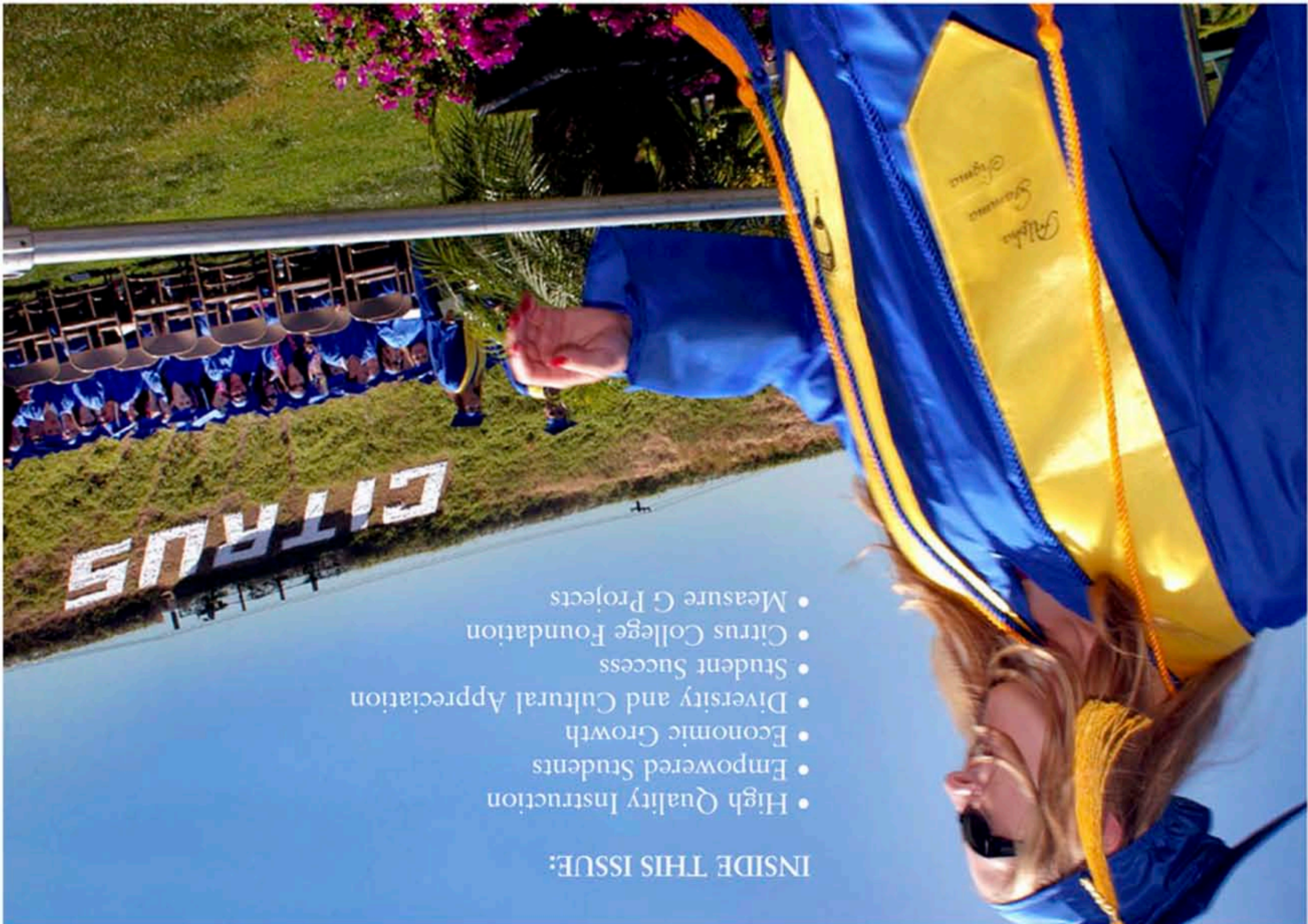
