# Citrus College to Confer Associate Degrees to Japanese American Students at Honorary Degree Ceremony

### What:

Citrus College will honor Toshio Asano and the late Masako Mukai Kusomoto at an Honorary Degree Ceremony on Tuesday, October 21, 2014. Asano and Kusomoto were Citrus College students whose education was disrupted during the 1941-1942 academic year as a result of Executive Order 9066, which resulted in the internment of Japanese Americans during World War II.

The Honorary Degree Ceremony is an initiative of the California Nisei College Diploma Project, a statewide effort in which the University of California, California State University and California Community Colleges locate individuals who were affected by Executive Order 9066 and confer their degrees.
