*Who's Who?

Continuing Students:

You are a **continuing** student if you previously enrolled in credit classes at Citrus College. Concurrent enrollment students are not considered continuing students and receive the lowest registration priority.

New Students:

You are a **new** student if you have never enrolled in credit classes at Citrus College.

Registration Priority:

New students who have completed college orientation, assessment, and have developed education plans, as well as continuing students in good standing who have not exceeded 100 degree applicable units, will have priority over students who do not meet these criteria.

The deadline to appeal receiving lower enrollment priority is April 15, 2019.

The enrollment priority deadline for new student orientation, and student educational plan is also April 15, 2019.
