### WHY STUDY ABROAD?

Less than 10% of US college students study abroad

- Shows college admissions and employers skills such as international perspective, cultural awareness, diversity, problem solving, "thinking out of the box"...
  - Personal skills you gain: independence, creativity, tolerance, openness, initiative, a sense of humor, adaptability, flexibility, values, patience...

85% of students agree that studying abroad was the most <u>meaningful</u> experience of their undergraduate education.



### STUDY ABROAD STATISTICS

• 100% greater improvement in GPA post study abroad.

- 97% of study abroad students found a job within 12 months of graduation vs. 47% of college graduates found employment in the same period.
- 25% higher salaries: that's how much more study abroad students earn than those college graduates who did not study abroad. That averages around \$7000 per year.
- 90% of study abroad alumni who applied got into their 1<sup>st</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup> choice of grad schools.

 GPA of 2.5 or higher


