

KYOTO

Kyoto is the cultural heart of Japan. The former home of the Emperor, Kyoto was the capital of Japan for over 1,000 years. This rich history lives on through Kyoto's people, food, shrines, temples, gardens, and festivals. Students will earn 3 to 6 units of CSU/UC transferable credits towards their degree while experiencing the beauty and uniqueness of Kyoto and the Kansai area. In addition to Kyoto's cultural and historic charms, students will also have the opportunity to visit Nara and the nearby, neon-lit metropolis of Osaka.

YOUR PROGRAM INCLUDES

- Accommodation in twin-bedded rooms in a centrally-located, WiFi-enabled apart-hotel.
- Orientation program on-site in Kyoto including an orientation meeting with AIFS staff, information packet, welcome dinner and guided, half-day walking tour of Kyoto.
- Pre-loaded smart card (IC) valid for travel on all JR trains, trams, subways and buses in the Kyoto metropolitan area as well as at select convenience stores, shops and restaurants.
- Entrance to Kinkaku-ji (Golden Pavilion).
- A traditional Japanese cooking class and a Japanese tea ceremony experience.
- Full-day excursion to Nara including round-trip transportation, a walking tour of the historical park with the services of a professional, English-speaking guide and entrance to Tōdai-ji (Great Eastern Temple).
- The services of the AIFS Program Coordinator for information, personal advising/counseling and 24-hour emergency contact service.
- Medical and Program Fee Refund Insurance policy.

FEES

Based on an enrollment of 20-24 participants, the fee per person is \$3,175. This fee excludes airfare, a \$125 refundable damage deposit, optional insurance upgrades, passport or visa fees if applicable, meals other than those listed, personal expenses, any Citrus College tuition or administrative fees, textbooks, additional field trips or excursions required by the Citrus College faculty and anything not specified. These fees are guaranteed not to change as a result of fluctuations in the \$ exchange rate.

OPTIONAL TRANSPORTATION PACKAGE

An introduction to the study of social psychology emphasizes the nature of socially determined behavior as seen in the areas of conformity, propaganda, prejudice, social roles, social process, social perception, and culturally determined personality.
