

Kyoto is the cultural heart of Japan. The former home of the Emperor, Kyoto was the capital of Japan for over 1,000 years. This rich history lives on through Kyoto's people, food, shrines, temples, gardens, and festivals. Students will earn 3 to 6 units of CSU/UC transferable credits towards their degree while experiencing the beauty and uniqueness of Kyoto and the Kansai area. In addition to Kyoto's cultural and historic charms, students will also have the opportunity to visit Nara, Himeji castle, and the nearby neon-lit metropolis of Osaka.

YOUR PROGRAM INCLUDES

- · Accommodation in twin or triple-bedded studio apartments in a centrally-located, WiFi-enabled apart-hotel.
- Orientation program in Kyoto including an orientation meeting with AIFS staff, information packet, welcome
 dinner and guided, half-day walking tour of Kyoto.
- Pre-loaded smart card (IC) valid for travel on all JR trains, trams, subways and buses in the Kyoto
 metropolitan area as well as at select convenience stores, shops and restaurants.
- Entrance to Eikando or Nanzenji Temple, and a guided tour of Nijo Castle.
- A traditional Japanese cooking class.
- Full-day excursion to Nara including round-trip transportation, a walking tour of the historical park with a professional, English-speaking guide and entrance to Tōdai-ji (Great Eastern Temple).
- Entrance with guided tour to a Zen Buddhist Temple, including an introduction to zazen meditation and a shōjin ryōri (monk-style) lunch.
- Farewell group meal.
- The services of the AIFS Tour Manager for information, personal advising/counseling and 24-hour emergency contact service.

FEES

Based on an enrollment of 20-29 participants, the fee per person is \$3,225. This fee excludes airfare, optional insurance upgrades, optional Hiroshima excursion, passport or visa fees if applicable, meals other than those listed, personal expenses, any Citrus College tuition or administrative fees, textbooks, additional field trips or excursions required by the Citrus College faculty and anything not specified. These fees are guaranteed not to change as a result of fluctuations in the \$ exchange rate.

ART 199 - MOTION PICTURE APPRECIATION

Strongly recommended: ENGL 101.

An introductory course in which the student will learn how to analyze films on technical, aesthetic, and thematic levels. Historically significant films will be used as source material.

3 Units (AA/AS; Citrus C1; CSU; IGETC 3A; UC; CSUGE C1). 54 lecture hours.

HIST 104 - HISTORY OF WORLD CIVILIZATION SINCE 1500

Strongly recommended: ENGL 101.

The course offers a survey of world civilizations from 1500's regional isolation to modern-day globalism and its issues and problems. Consideration will be given to the political, economic, social, and intellectual forces present in the rise of the modern world. Particular focus will be given to the interrelatedness of historical events and on the comparisons of cultures and societies in a historical perspective. College-level reading is strongly advised.

3 Units (AA/AS; Citrus D1; CSU; IGETC 3B; UC; IGETC 4F; CSUGE C2; CSUGE D6). 54 lecture hours.

OPTIONAL HIROSHIMA EXCURSION

An optional weekend in Hiroshima is available, including a travel pass for round-trip transportation, two nights' hotel accommodation with daily breakfast, entrance to Hiroshima Peace Memorial Museum, full-day excursion to Miyajima including round-trip public transportation, round-trip ferry tickets from Miyajimaguchi Station to Miyajima, entrance to Itsukushima Shrine and the services of an AIFS Representative for \$495.
